

Police News

Welcome back to all of those who have returned from their summer holidays on the coast and overseas. Its great to see the town a buzz again and the kids back at school.

Further good news in congratulations to the Three Springs community where there have not been any reported criminal offences during the past reporting period.

There were 18 matters heard in the Three Springs Magistrates Court on the 29th of January 2020. The results were as follows:

A 69 year old male from Morawa was convicted of driving without a licence (Fines Suspended) he received a \$100 fine and court costs of \$225.90.

A 38 year old male from Perenjori was convicted of driving with a blood alcohol level exceeding excess 0.08%. He received a \$900 fine, court costs of \$225.90 and his licence was cancelled for 10 months.

A 31 year old male from Morgantown was convicted of Possessing Cannabis. He received a fine of \$1000 and court costs of \$225.90.

A 78 year old male from Lesmurdie was convicted of driving without a licence (Cancelled). He received a \$1000 fine, court costs of \$225.90 and his licence was cancelled for 9 months.

A 52 year old male from Morawa was convicted of Possessing Cannabis. He received a \$500 fine and court costs of \$225.90.

A 65 year old male from Falcon was convicted of driving without a licence (Expired). He received a \$100 fine and court costs of \$225.90.

A 19 year old male from Morawa was convicted of driving without a licence (Never Held). He received a fine of \$100 and court costs of \$225.90.

A 70 year old male from Mingenew was convicted of driving with a blood alcohol level exceeding 0.05%. He received a \$500 fine, court costs of \$225.90 and his licence was cancelled for 6 months.

A 59 year old male from Carnamah was convicted of driving with a blood alcohol level exceeding 0.05%. He received a \$400 fine and court costs of \$225.90.

A 59 year old male from Coorow was convicted of driving with a blood alcohol level exceeding 0.08%. He received a \$550 fine, court costs of \$225.90 and his licence was cancelled for 7 months.

A 44 year old male from Mullewa was convicted of possessing drug paraphernalia, driving an unlicenced vehicle and driving a vehicle with a false number plate. He received a fine of \$600 and court costs of \$225.90.

A 50 year old male from Golden Bay was convicted of driving without a licence (Expired). He received a fine of \$150 and court costs of \$225.90.

Midlands Biosecurity Group formally recognised by State

The Midlands Biosecurity Group was recently formally Recognised by the Minister for Agriculture as the 15th Recognised Biosecurity Group in Western Australia. Recognised Biosecurity Groups aim to ensure a locally driven co-ordinated, landscape-scale response to pest management.

The group recently held its Annual General Meeting to elect a new Board of Management. The election was conducted by an independent judicator and all Full members of the Biosecurity Group were given an opportunity to vote either in person or via proxy. The new Board members are:

Following the AGM, the inaugural board discussed the Operational Plan for the group which is planned to be implemented from July 2020. The Operational Plan is made up of three pest control programs which are:

Wild Fox & European Fox Program Feral Pig Program

European Rabbit Program

The MBG has summarised each of the planned programs below

These programs have been designed to support landholders in implementing best-practice pest management techniques in a co-ordinated fashion. The plan includes a budget for each of these programs, plus administration.

The plan is soon to be submitted to the Minister of Agriculture for consideration, to be funded through a Declared Pest Rate, which will be matched 50:50 with state government funding. The minister will open the plan for consultation in the first half of 2020 with each landholder in the MBG region receiving a letter.

MBG WILD DOG AND RED FOX PROGRAM 2020

The Wild Dog & Red Fox program will run in tandem with each other. Currently in the Midlands Biosecurity Group region, wild dog numbers are relatively low, while red fox numbers are high. Given that wild dogs are present in the region, it is important that land managers use wild dog strength baits to avoid bait-shyness in the wild dog population by exposing them to sub-lethal fox strength baits.

Poison-baiting is the most effective broad-scale fox control technique currently available. The MBG will be providing information to landholders about best-practice baiting techniques and encourage landholders to

co-ordinate baiting together to ensure maximum impact at the right time. The group plans to run baiting days, where land-holders will be able to discuss baiting strategies and take home bags of baits for use on their

properties (Restricted Chemical Permit required). Licensed Pest Management Technicians (LPMT) will be

available to assist farmers with their programs as well as continue to monitor areas of known wild dog hotspots. These technicians also help land-managers to make assessments as to whether leg-hold traps for wild dog control are suitable for their situation.

The first round of baiting days will be held in late 2020 in the following areas: Watheroo, Warradarge, Three Springs East, North Eneabba, Regan's Ford, Miling.

MBG FERAL PIG PROGRAM

In December 2018 & March 2019, aerial shooting days in the Mingenew & Morawa region removed 544 pigs from the landscape in that region. Significant numbers of feral pigs have been reported throughout the Midlands region, however actual numbers have not yet been quantified. Feral pigs have a reproductive potential more similar to rabbits than any other pest. Sows can breed from six months of age and can have up to two litters per year with an average litter size of six piglets. Feral pigs rely on water when moving throughout the landscape to keep cool and provide quality food.

Best practice feral pig control is centred around co-ordinated free-feeding and introduction of poison grain. Shooting is considered effective for small numbers of pigs and used as a 'mopping-up' exercise after a baiting program. Shooting alone has shown to have little impact on long term numbers of feral pigs and can scatter surviving pigs further through the landscape.

The MBG feral pig program plans to run across 100 properties a year starting in early 2021. This program will provide coordination, poison and a mop-up aerial shoot.

EUROPEAN RABBIT PROGRAM

Rabbit numbers are high in many areas of the Midlands Biosecurity Group region. Rabbits are prolific breeders and can produce five or more litters per year with an average of five young per litter. Female rabbits can breed from four months of age. There are a range of control methods used for rabbit control. Poison grain is the main form of control that should be used in conjunction with warren ripping, shooting and biological controls (i.e. virus). The MBG will provide co-ordination across land-tenure and provisions of baits and equipment.

SUPPORT AND COORDINATION PROGRAM

The Midlands Biosecurity Group (MBG) will provide support to landholders to access the latest information, assistance with applications for Restricted Chemical Permits and on ground support with control methods. The aim of the Recognised Biosecurity Group is to achieve co-ordinated control across the landscape. The area prescribed in the MBG has been chosen as it is connected by parkland, river systems and catchments. This includes Beekeepers reserve, the Watheroo National

Park, the Yarra Yarra lake system and its catchment, and the Moore River. Around 25% of the area is managed by the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA). The MBG and DBCA staff have been working together to develop a Memorandum of Understanding to ensure the Nil Tenure approach to pest management is achieved.

Over the next 6 mths the MBG will be continue with its on-ground activities, funded through the state and federal governments and the sheep industry. The group have three Licensed Pest Management Technicians (LPMT) who are working with growers and land managers to monitor pest activity and assist growers with their control programs. In February, a number of workshops will be held throughout the seven shires of the MBG area. These workshops will provide an update on the MBG's on-ground activities as well as continuing to provide information around pest management. The MBG Board of Management and executive officer will be available to present to community groups and councils about the MBG to answer any questions raised.

Full membership is free and available to any person who owns or occupies over 100ha of land in the Midlands region. Membership is not applied automatically to those farming in the region and an application form must be filled out. Membership allows members exclusive and full voting rights at member meetings of the group including the AGM as well as access to the latest information.



Don't waste money on extended warranties

Are you looking to buy white goods, electrical items or a new car in the near future? Chances are you'll be offered an extended warranty by the salesperson but you need to think twice before saying "yes" because you could be wasting your money.

In Australia, things we buy from a business come with a number of automatic guarantees due to our consumer laws. Consumer Protection often finds that extended warranties – which are really a type of in surance policy – can result in consumers paying for repair or replacement rights they are legally entitled to for FREE.

Under the Australian Consumer Law, any product or service purchased from a business must be: without faults;

fit for the intended purpose;

matching any description or sample; and

last a reasonable amount of time, depending on what it is and how much it cost.

When you're in a shop or car dealership, a salesperson might highlight the manufacturer's warranty expiry date as a way to upsell you an extended warranty. But if we consider an example of a \$2,000 TV with a manufacturer's warranty of 12 months, if something goes wrong after 18 months, consumer law will protect the purchase because it's reasonable to expect an expensive TV to last longer than one year.

Salespeople might claim an extended warranty is the easiest way to deal with problems with a purchase in future but claims you will get a replacement "hassle-free" in the event of a fault should not be a drawcard. You don't need to buy a warranty to get redress in the event of a fault and you won't have to deal with the manufacturer directly – a retailer should do this on the consumer's behalf.

So next time you're offered an extended warranty, ask lots of questions and press the seller on the benefits that are above and beyond consumer law. Why buy an insurance policy for a scenario that is already covered for free?!

Stargazing Tip

Coming up is a "Supermoon"! This year, there are two full Moons popularly known as "Supermoons". They rise in March and April.

The Moon's orbit around Earth is slightly oval shaped or elliptical. So, every month there's a time when the Moon is at its closest distance to Earth (at perigee) and another time when it is at its furthest distance from Earth (at apogee).

When perigee coincides with the full Moon, it's popularly called a "Supermoon". And when the Moon is at apogee? Well, it's a "Micromoon"! Although these are not official astronomical terms, they certainly grab your attention which means we have more people heading outside to gaze up at the wonderful night sky.

When to look: 10th March 2020. Moonrise is at 7.25pm. The Moon will be at perigee and only 357,122 kms from Earth. The Moon rises in the east.

What's New for Astrotourism?

There are 15 Astrotourism Towns in the network across the Mid West and Wheatbelt regions and momentum continues to grow. Both regions have key competitive advantages that make it a draw card for visitors to experience a dark night sky.

There have been some reports of independent visitors and regular enquiries from bus tour operators being received. The question asked is "How can I include stargazing on my tour?" More work is underway to support the development of itineraries and tours. There are some business opportunities for local residents with an interest in astronomy.

The community stargazing events have been a real success. 2020 kicked off with an outstanding event in Wagin. A 50 strong crowd enjoyed learning more about what Astrotourism can mean to the local industry. Several residents brought telescopes for a quick lesson on how to use them. They're now off and running.


