Don't mistake hand sanitiser for food or drink

We all know that clean hands are one of the best ways to guard against viruses, so it's little surprise that hand sanitiser has become a must-have item during the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic.

With many households and schools now using hand sanitiser as part of their daily routines, it's important to remember these products should be treated with extra caution especially around children.

Most alcohol-based sanitisers contain upwards of 60 per cent alcohol content, meaning just a couple of mouthfuls can be enough to poison a child.

Poison centres across Australia have seen an increase in adverse reports involving these products, and in WA we are aware of at least one incident of a child ingesting hand sanitiser at school.

Given these products are packaged in a range of container types, including plastic bottles with pop-top lids, there is greater potential for them to be mistaken for food or drink.

For this reason, Consumer Protection has joined the ACCC in working with suppliers to make sure hand sanitiser is not sold in packaging that resembles food or drink bottles, including releasing new guidance that can be accessed at:

www.productsafety.gov.au/news/covid-19-safer-packaging-and-labelling-guidance-for-hand-sanitiser-suppliers

Consumers who use their own bottles at in-store hand sanitiser refill stations should clearly mark their bottles to avoid confusion with any other household or food items.

When buying hand sanitiser, check the label for any ingredients that may cause an allergic reaction to you or your family. If the label fails to list any ingredients, you should report the product to the ACCC.

Hand sanitiser should always be kept out of reach of children, and should only be used by children under adult supervision. As a highly flammable product, it should also be kept away from any type of open flame. If ingestion is suspected, call the Poisons Information Centre immediately on 13 11 26 (24 hours a day) to seek urgent medical advice.

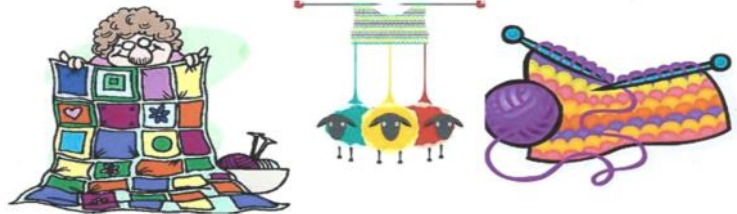

Cast on 40 stitches, using garter stitch (plain knitting) knit 73 rows, Cast Off.

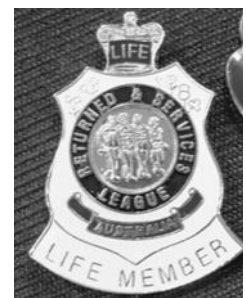
If possible please knit strips 40 inches in length as they are easier to join together

Declared Pest Rate posted to fight ferals

The Midlands Biosecurity Group (MBG) is nearing 12 months in operation and much has been achieved in this time. Formally recognised by the Minister for Agriculture, the group is now an independent not-for-profit organisation with three contracted Licensed Pest Management Technicians on the ground assisting land holders. Due to their significant populations and detriment to the region economically and environmentally, the MBG's current pest priorities are foxes, feral pigs, rabbits and wild dogs. Although in lower numbers evidence of wild dog activity, including stock losses, spans from Gingin, Eneabba, Watheroo Dandaragan, Arrowsmith, and Mingenew. In some instances however, suspected wild dog activity such as stock attacks are the result of straying domestic dogs. To continue our work into the future and to ensure a nil-tenure, landscape scale approach to biosecurity, the MBG Board has requested a Declared Pest Rate (DPR) be implemented in the Shires of Dandaragan, Moora, Coorow, Carnamah, Three Springs, Mingenew and Irwin. Raised funds will go towards integrated control programs for the MBG's current pest priorities. All funds raised must be spent within the Midlands region and all land holders have the opportunity to participate in the programs as they wish. Please watch the local papers for updates on these activities. Landholders will receive a letter in the coming weeks outlining proposed rates from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, who are accepting feedback. Please note that an error was published in the first letter, which has been amended and a second letter

posted outlining the correct amount. Below are some key points about the (DPR) in the Midlands region and how it is calculated. The MBG is seeking \$167,000 in revenue from Declared Pest Rates. This figure will be matched by the State Government on a 1:1 basis. There are 1,384 Valuation Entity Numbers (VENs) in the MBG area that will be rated. VENs are individual parcels of land that can be rated. A landholder may hold a single or multiple VENs. The biosecurity rating assessment system (BRAMS) calculates the rate (cents-in-the-dollar) based on each group's operational plan budget and parameters recommended by the group; in MBGs case to raise \$167,000 with a minimum rate payable amount of \$100 per VEN on no less than 100ha. The minimum payable amount is applied on all rateable VENs in the first instance. This generates \$138,400 or 82% of the revenue required. The shortfall amount required (\$28,600) to meet the operational plan budget of \$167,000 is applied via an ad valorem rate at 0.0089 cents-in-the-dollar. The calculation also takes into account the requirement for all payable amounts to be below the 2% of the UV value cap imposed by the BAM Act 2007. In order to arrive at the rate (cents-in-the-dollar) to raise the required amount, the system performs several iterations of complex calculations.



1,037 VENS (~75%) in the MBG area are liable to be charged the minimum rate payable amount of \$100. Information on the group's planned activities can be found at www.mbg.org.au. The group continues to explore further options for funding through state, federal and industry sources. Landholders are encouraged to sign up today for their free MBG membership, which can be done through the website.
