As we move closer to Spring we approach wild flower season. This is a fantastic time of the year with the wildflowers coming into bloom and the crops bursting in colour from recent rains. This also means an influx of tourists in the town and vehicles on the roads. Please be patient as these groups often have a caravan in tow and may not be experienced regional road users. Remember its all about getting where you need to go and back home again safely.

You may have noticed the WA State Government advertising campaign educating road users of the recent changes to using a mobile phone whilst driving offences and penalties.

From September 1st:

Touching or holding a mobile phone to make, receive or end a voice call.

Penalty: \$500 and 3 demerit points.

Creating, sending or looking at a text, email, social media, photo, video or similar.

Penalty: \$1000 and 4 demerit points.

Neither I or any of my staff would take any pleasure in issuing fines like this so please do the right thing and leave your mobile phone alone whilst driving. It is simply not worth the safety risk or the financial pain.

In relation to reporting criminal offences, if you believe you have been subject of an offence please report it to WA Police on 131 444 or Three Springs Police on 99544222 at your earliest opportunity. Please do not handle anything related to the offence as in doing so you can potentially contaminate any evidentiary material. I know this may not always be possible but our best opportunity to gather evidence is with early police attendance and an untouched crime scene. If you are unable to do this please ensure you take as many photographs of the scene as possible prior to moving anything.

Finally, I have been very pleased to see the community support for the winter sports teams and programs here in Three Springs. There has been record attendances at home games and no reports of anti-social behaviour. These are family friendly events and a great opportunity for the community to come together and support your Three Springs teams. Sport plays an integral part of physical fitness as well as assisting our mental health. There are many well documented benefits for not just the players but also the coaches, helpers and supporters. This week we move into the finals so I wish all of the Three Springs teams success and hopeful we can get them all into the grand finals in Three Springs in a few weeks.

Strike Energy Update

West Erregulla 3 (WE 3) Conventional Gas Well Drilling

Rig Move to commence 20th August 2020

As part of the Appraisal Plan for the West Erregulla field, Strike Energy scheduled the drilling start for the 11th September. The Geraldton based contractor Lenane Nominees has completed the Civil works for the drilling pad and access track of Natta Road. "Trucks Entering" signs are installed on Natta Rd and rig mobilisation trucks will start arriving next week. Most trucks will come from the east via Mingenew. Strike has consulted with the Shire of Mingenew and the trucks will mainly follow the highlighted green route through town travelling South. Once on Mingenew South Road the trucks will turn west onto Yandanooka West Rd and then south onto Natta Road.

The first trucks are scheduled to arrive Thursday 20th of August spread over 5 days with another 5 days of truck arrivals from about 31st of August. I would like to thank everyone for their patience and understanding during the period of increased traffic.



BAIT DAY HOSTS

A team effort is needed to apply best practice of baiting, trapping and shooting for feral pest control across the entire Midlands Biosecurity Group (MBG) region.

The MBG is seeking a voluntary network of Bait Day hosts to host community bait making days, store equipment on your property and allow local farmers to come on to your farm to access baits. The MBG will provide equipment including bait racks, freezers and signage, as well as baiting poison and meat. Licensed Pest Management Technicians will be on site to handle the poison and oversee the process.

Fresh meat baits will be prepared twice a year for year-round fox and dog control. Grain baits for pig and rabbit control will be prepared in Autumn. The MBG is looking for hosts in the shires of Irwin, Mingenew, Three Springs, Carnamah, Coorow, Moora and Dandaragan.

The first round of bait days will be run in Spring 2020.

SPOTLIGHT ON SOIL HEALTH ACROSS THE REGION

A new initiative by local grower groups will see the delivery of a soil health survey to better understand the current issues being faced by landholders across the Shires of Coorow, Dandaragan, and Moora.

West Midlands Group (WMG) executive officer Dr. Nathan Craig said that while the focus is on soil health, the survey will also delve into the broader issues and opportunities that are faced by landholders now and what is perceived in the future.

"Completing this survey will allow local groups and government to identify the issues and areas where they can really make a difference for landholders," said Dr. Craig.

An advance notice will soon be sent to landholders of greater than 10 hectares in the region and will give the option to complete the survey online if preferred. This will then be followed by a hardcopy survey.

A key feature is that the surveys are georeferenced, allowing trends across the landscape to be identified and giving local grower groups, the Cooperative Research Centre for High Performance Soils (Soil CRC), a centre established in 2017, and local government the opportunity to provide targeted support landholders where required.

This survey will be completed again in five years to follow the changes that have occurred during this time.

The WMG and Liebe Group are supporting the delivery of this survey in conjunction with the Southern Cross University.

Dr. Craig said the project was made possible through the WMG's linkages with the Soil CRC, a group established in 2017 to give farmers the knowledge and tools they need to make decisions on extremely complex soil management issues.

"We are working with the Soil CRC to bridge the gap between soil scientists and farmers, to ensure that soil performance is increased not just in the short term, but in the long term," said Dr Nathan

In these uncertain times, the West Midlands Group is working hard to ensure we can continue our delivery of valuable information and support to farm businesses across the region.

We will return to delivering face-to-face learning at the earliest opportunity.

Applications now open for Durack Regional Connectivity Program

5 August 2020

Applications for the Australian Government's \$53 million Regional Connectivity Program are now open.

The Program will provide targeted investment in local telecommunications infrastructure projects to maximise economic and social opportunities in regional, rural, and remote communities across the country.

Federal Member for Durack, the Hon Melissa Price, is encouraging telecommunications providers, regional communities, regional development organisations, as well as state, territory and local governments to collaborate and apply for funding through the Program.

"We are taking a 'place-based' approach to investment through the Program because we recognise our regions make an enormous contribution to our economy nationally but have distinct digital needs that require custom solutions," Ms Price said.

The Program complements the National Broadband Network rollout which is delivering fast, affordable broadband to all Australians, and the Mobile Black Spot Program, which is switching on reliable mobile coverage in rural and remote areas.

Examples of projects that could be funded under the Program include upgrades to mobile infrastructure to improve community access to telehealth, remote education and retail internet and phone services, or the development of enterprise-grade broadband networks to support local agricultural, manufacturing and tourism businesses to engage more competitively online.

Minister for Regional Communications, Mark Coulton, said potential applicants should work together to develop projects for funding to maximise the benefits for communities.

"Collaboration is an excellent method to give an application real 'bite'. We are looking for projects that will provide the most profound benefit to local communities," Minister Coulton said.

All interested parties are encouraged to use the Program Noticeboard to share resources and expertise on projects and work together to improve connectivity for regional communities.

The online <u>Program Noticeboard</u> provides a portal for collaboration where applicants can find and register potential projects, linking regional communities and industry providers.

Royalties for Regions: Established in 2008 under the Royalties for Regions Act, this program originally saw funds generated in the regions set aside for spending in the regions. The latest quarterly financial report tabled by the McGowan Labor government shows there is a \$200 million underspend in Royalties for Regions this year. Labor's budget projections over the next four years show \$1.6 billion is forecast to be lost to regional WA. These unspent RfR funds will now flow into consolidated revenue, funding Perth-based projects such as MetroNet. Many communities have been badly affected by the economic impact of COVID 19. Investment from Royalties for Regions would help address these impacts. The people of regional WA have been short changed by Labor and have every right to feel aggrieved.

Be in the know about demos

There's a lot to like about demonstrator vehicles – they're practically new cars with very few kilometres that sell for cheaper prices than you'd otherwise pay for a genuine new motor.

Another bonus is that clock only starts ticking on the time aspect of the manufacturer's warranty (e.g.

5-years) on the date of purchase by a consumer and not while it's in the dealership's possession. Conversely, the distance aspect of the warranty (e.g. 100,000km) will be less the kilometres already travelled when the new owner takes possession.

We were recently concerned to learn of a consumer who purchased what they presumed to be a demo car, but was instead told by the dealership it was 'dealer pre-owned' meaning the warranty had started two years earlier on the date it rolled off the production line.

This rang alarm-bells with our Automotive Branch because according to the *Motor Vehicles Act*, a 'dealer pre-owned' vehicle is not a legally recognised term.

Under the legislation, a motor vehicle can only be considered 'new', 'second-hand' or as a 'demonstrator', meaning the ambiguous phrase 'dealer-owned' is nothing more than industry jargon that we believe causes confusion.

Our investigation resulted in the dealer confirming our position that the vehicle was in fact a demo vehicle with a 5-year manufacturer's warranty that should have instead started on the purchase-date.

In addition to manufacturer warranties, consumers are entitled to certain guarantees under Australian Consumer Law (ACL), including that the vehicle is safe, fault-free and matches the description outlined by the dealer. For example, a car's airbags should work and if metallic white is the description, a different non-metallic colour car should not be supplied.

These ACL rights may in turn mean that any extended warranty offered could be unnecessary, as it could result in a consumer paying extra for a repair or replacement they are legally entitled to for free. Always ask – 'what does the extended warranty get me that I would not already be entitled to under the Australian Consumer Law?'

Consumers should know that they don't have to deal with the manufacturer directly when a product is faulty – a retailer should do this on the consumer's behalf.

Should you buy-now, pay-later?

The way we shop may have changed forever following the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic.

Life in lockdown meant cash transactions plummeted in favour of a number of contactless payment methods, including buy-now, pay-later schemes.

Often described as the 'modern-day lay-by', buy-now, pay-later arrangements allow you to receive goods and then pay off the amount in instalments further down the track. Unlike lay-by, the item is available to you straight away.

At the height of the pandemic, prominent buy-now, pay later business Afterpay picked-up 1 million new users and recorded its best ever quarter to June with \$2 billion spent on buying goods and services. While Afterpay is the most dominant force in the market, its rivals include a growing number of similar platforms such as zipPay, BrightePay, Payright and Openpay.

Even though you can buy-now, pay-later – is it a good idea? The key advice is to check the terms and conditions before you sign up to any scheme. They are often promoted as "interest-free" but late fees, account-keeping fees or payment processing fees may apply.

For example, while you may make a purchase for \$100, one late payment could cost you up to a further \$17 plus any potential bank fee for a payment default.

A review by the Australian Securities and Investment Commission (ASIC) in 2018 found that one in six buy-now, pay-later users had become overdrawn, delayed bill payments or borrowed additional money. Most consumers reported that the option allowed them to buy more expensive items and generally spend more than they normally would.

- Link your buy-now-pay-later account to your debit card instead of your credit card – that way you are using your own money and will avoid extra debts or interest.
- Don't overcommit stick to a limit and only have one buy-now, pay-later at a time.
- Contact your provider straight away if you're having trouble making repayments.
