




# **Police News**

Three Springs Police have had a very busy couple of weeks. A reflection of this is at the next sitting of the Three Springs Magistrates Court on the 18<sup>th</sup> of November 2020 there will be over 20 matters to be heard by the Magistrate. The offences range from traffic, assaults, threats, damage, prohibited drugs and violence restraining order offences. It is important to recognise that not all of the offences have occurred in Three Springs alone but also; Mingenew, Morawa, Perenjori and Carnamah.

It has been noted that a number of Three Springs residents, myself included have recently received a number of attempted telephone scam calls. The people that conduct these types of illegal activities are more often than not based off shore in other countries which makes it impossible for ourselves and WA Police to prosecute them. The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission has established a website "scamwatch.gov.au" which offers advice and provides an opportunity if you wish to make a formal report.

Their methodologies are forever evolving but the most common are people impersonating representatives from the Australian Tax Office, Computer Tech Support, Banking Institutions, Telstra and International Law Enforcement Agencies. The best advice I can offer is never give your personal details to anyone over the phone unless you are 100% satisfied they are who they say they are. It is important to trust your instincts with these types of calls, so if it doesn't feel right it is likely that it isn't.

With harvest underway we have a large number of heavy haulage vehicles on the roads coming through and around our town. Please be extra vigilant during this period as these vehicles due to their size and weight are far less responsive than a motorcar. In particular if you're on a bicycle, either an adult or child please ensure you are observing the road rules, which includes wearing a helmet.

I'm happy to announce Three Springs Police have joined forces with the Shire of Three Springs and the Three Springs Primary School to help celebrate NAIDOC week. With a number of celebrations and activities planned for Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> of November we look forward to joining forces and recognising the history and contributions made by indigenous persons.

# How can a survey help support and build resilience for West Australian Farmers?



This week, one and a half thousand farmers and landholders on the Northern Wheatbelt of Western Australia will have received a survey booklet in the mail.

The surveys are part of a Soil CRC (Cooperative Research Centre) project to understand what farm management practices are being undertaken, and why farmers choose the farming methods that they do.

They also aim to determine what information and technical support farmers are seeking.

Led by Southern Cross University's Dr Hanabeth Luke, the project is a collaboration with local farming groups the West Midlands Group and the Liebe Group, as well as the Wheatbelt Natural Resource Management Board and WANTFA. West Australian Farmers No Till Association.

It has been funded by the Soil CRC and will be repeated in five years to measure any changes.

"We're gathering a national data set to gain an understanding of what's happening for Australian farmers and for soils across our farming systems," said Dr Luke.

"To be able to better support farmers and farming systems to become more resilient, we need to understand the important challenges faced by farmers; their goals and what support they need to reach those goals."

"We also need to understand the decision-making behind why they operate as they do: are they adopting best practice and new innovative approaches? If not, we need to understand what the barriers to this may be. For example, are barriers economic or a knowledge issue? Or do they relate to things like values and trust in local organisations?"

"All of these things come together to help us to understand the complexities driving these systems so the partner organisations and scientists from the Soil CRC can best target their efforts."

The survey has been co-designed by Dr Luke and partners to guide strategic directions of the West Midlands Group, the Liebe Group, Wheatbelt NRM and WANTFA, with support from the shires of Moora, Dalwallinu, Wongan-Ballidu, Dandaragan and Coorow.

Nathan Craig, the Executive Officer of the West Midlands Group who has been closely involved in developing the survey, says that "this is a really important opportunity for input to support our efforts to support our farmers in the Northern Wheatbelt"

David Minkey of WANTFA says that "Of all the surveys you're sent this year, this is the one you should do, because for our association we're all about managing the soil because it is the most valuable resource we have. So, we need to have a sound understanding of our soil management practices so we can improve together."

"The end goal of the project is to ascertain how to best engage and support farmers moving into the future. We need to be developing resilience now more than ever across our farming systems," said Dr Luke.

The survey will be mailed out with a postage paid return envelope and Dr Luke would be grateful if it were mailed back at the earliest convenience.

# Second bite at rent relief grant

Even though Western Australians are getting back on their feet post the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic, there are some who are still struggling to make ends meet due to losing their jobs or suffering reduced hours at work.

If you're a tenant whose income has dropped 75 per cent or more, you should know that the Residential Rent Relief Grant Scheme – which covers four-weeks' rent up to the value of \$2,000 – is still available.

Renters who were not able to access the grant earlier in the year are encouraged to revisit their application to assess if they are now eligible, while tenants who have already received a grant can apply for a second time if they're still struggling financially due to COVID-19. The grants are paid directly to landlords, who must reduce the rent by the amount received.

In addition to monetary help, a number of other tenancy relief measures have been extended until 28 March 2021, such as the moratorium on rent increases.

Anyone who wants to take advantage of the low rental vacancy rates by purchasing an investment property does not, under COVID-19 tenancy laws, face any restriction on how much rent they charge. The only exception is where there is an existing tenant in the property at the time of purchase, as the existing lease arrangements and the rent at the established rate transfers to the new landlord.

When it comes to evictions, tenants cannot be forced to leave for non-payment of rent if they have been financially affected by the pandemic, but they can be evicted for damage, anti-social or illegal behaviour or refusing to pay rent if they are not in financial hardship, as well as failing to repay under a negotiated rental agreement.

If a landlord is in financial hardship and needs to move back into their property, they can apply to the court to terminate a tenancy. Landlords are also within their rights to sell their investment property if they wish.

# Tiny batteries – big danger

They might look harmless, but in the wrong hands (and mouths) button batteries can become child killers.

Every week in Australia, 20 children present to an emergency department following exposure to button batteries, with one child a month suffering serious injuries. If swallowed, coin-sized lithium button batteries can lodge in a child's system and the resulting chemical reaction can cause severe burns to their oesophagus and other internal organs. Likewise the insertion of button batteries into ears and noses can also lead to significant injuries.

A grieving Queensland couple recently went public with the story of how their three -year-old daughter died earlier this year after the button-battery she swallowed went undetected for nine days. Her vomiting, nose-bleed and chest-pain were initially attributed to a virus, meaning that when an X-ray was finally performed, it was tragically too late.

It's important to realise that button batteries are potentially lurking everywhere in your home – they power remote controls, kitchen scales, birthday cards, children's toys and hearing aids, to name just a few of the places you might find them. So when buying a toy, household device or novelty item, you should ideally look for products that are rechargeable or contain other types of batteries that are less dangerous.

If you do need to buy a button-battery operated product, look for battery compartments that are difficult for children to access, such as those that require a tool or dual simultaneous movements to open.

Even old or spent button batteries can still pose a threat, so always dispose of them immediately in a safe manner, out of children's reach.

Remember that it's an emergency if you think your child has swallowed one – do not let them eat or drink, do not induce vomiting and call the Poisons Information Centre immediately on 13 11 26.

If your child is having any difficulty breathing, call 000. Once at the hospital, ask for an X-ray.

# IN MOORE WITH LOVE

3 November 2020

The latest state budget shows \$2.7 billion has been ripped from the \$4.2 billion Royalties for Regions program, at a time when regional WA is the pillar of economic strength and the hope of the whole nation for economic recovery. Our wealth is generated in regional WA, yet Labor have ravaged Royalties for Regions.

Communities have been crying out for help following a downturn of business due to COVID-19 and regional worker shortages, which Labor have chosen to ignore. The unreliable power supply in the Mid West resembles that of a third-world country and farmers in the Great Southern can not source water for their livestock.

Western Australia should not miss the opportunity recovering from the current crisis can present. We need to hit restart and refresh in regional areas and Royalties for Regions is well placed to respond, only Labor have diverted unspent RfR funds to projects in the Metropolitan area such as Metronet. Other country communities across Australia talk about building back better following a major fire, flood, drought or a pandemic. A smart Government should harness the innovation and adaptability we have seen and experienced during this unprecedented time and use those elements as an agent for change and development. Labor has responded with a misguided \$20 million commitment to move the old Department of Agriculture offices (now DPIRD) from South Perth to an office block in the centre of Perth.

The Nationals WA descended on Albany for their annual state conference on 16 and 17 October where they reaffirmed their determination to restore the integrity of Royalties for Regions. Tourist infrastructure was on the conference agenda, with one motion calling on the State Government to use unspent Royalties for Regions funds on regional projects, starting with the failed groin structure of the Jurien Bay Boat Harbour. A further motion called for a dedicated Royalties for Regions fund to facilitate investment in tourism infrastructure to capitalise on increasing demand from the domestic tourism sector and boost local economies. A motion from the Moore Branch of The Nationals WA called for minimum network standards for mobile network performance and the use of stand-alone power solutions to improve the reliability of the phone network.

Addressing power issues in the Mid West, The Nationals in government would commit to a \$35 million Community Energy Fund to encourage regional households and communities to install 'behind the meter' batteries for electricity storage, addressing some of the reliability and affordability challenges often faced in regional WA. Under Nationals WA policy, \$2,000 rebates would be offered for up to 10,000 behind-the-meter batteries in residential and commercial premises across regional WA. Another \$500,000 would support behind-the-meter community batteries for eligible regional community groups.

# Is Your Dog Microchipped?

The *Dog Act* 1976 provides that on and after 1 November 2015, the owner of a dog that has reached three months of age must ensure that the dog is microchipped.

# How do I get my dog microchipped?

A veterinarian (vet), veterinarian nurse or a person with the relevant qualifications from a registered training provider is able to implant a microchip in your dog.

To find out how you can arrange for your dog to be microchipped, contact your regular vet or local government to obtain information on where you can take your dog to be microchipped.

### My dog is old and unwell, is it still required to be microchipped?

A dog is exempt from the microchipping requirement if a vet issues a certificate stating that the implantation of a microchip in the dog may adversely affect the health and welfare of the dog. Such a certificate cannot apply in respect of a dog that is under three months of age.

### When will I be required to prove my dog is microchipped?

When you re-register your dog, you will be required to provide proof that the dog has been microchipped, by providing the local government with the microchip number.

### How will microchipping my dog assist me?

If you lose your microchipped dog, it will make it easier for you to be reunited. The dog's microchip can be scanned by the ranger or a vet, which will reveal the owner's contact details.

If your dog is impounded and it is discovered that it has not been microchipped, you may be liable for a fine. As a result, it is in your best interests to ensure your dog is microchipped.

### What happens if I do not get my dog microchipped?

A person who fails to ensure their dog is microchipped on and after 1 November 2015 is liable for a fine of up to \$5,000.




