Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment

The Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment (AGDRP) is a one-off payment to help you if you're significantly affected by a declared disaster. It's not for minor damage or inconvenience.



How much you can get

If you're eligible you'll get:

- \$1,000 per adult
- \$400 for each child younger than 16.



Who can get it

To get AGDRP you must:

- be an Australian resident or hold an eligible visa
- be 16 years or older at the time of the disaster or getting a social security payment
- meet Local Government Area (LGA) eligibility requirements.

You must also have been adversely affected by a declared disaster. For example:

- you were seriously injured
- you're the immediate family member of an Australian citizen or resident who died or is missing
- the disaster destroyed your principal place of residence or it must be demolished
- there's been major damage to the interior of your principal place of residence
- the disaster has exposed the interior of your principal place of residence to the elements
- your principal place of residence has been declared structurally unsound
- sewage has contaminated the interior of your residence

- the disaster has destroyed or damaged a major asset or assets you own at your principal place of residence
- you're the principal carer of a dependent child who has experienced any of the above.



Definitions

- Your principal place of residence is the main place where you have a right or license to normally live. It doesn't include holiday homes or investment properties.
- A major asset is an asset or assets with a combined market value of \$20,000 or more. For example, this includes buildings, vehicles, caravans, water tanks or large scale machinery.
- You're a principal carer of a child if the child is your dependent and hasn't turned 16. The principal carer must have legal responsibility for the day-to-day care, welfare and development of the child.



How to claim

The fastest way to claim is to call **180 22 66**.

If you're a member of a couple, you can both claim this payment. You and your partner must make separate claims.

Post disaster insurance tips

Now that Cyclone Seroja has come and gone, many regional Western Australians will be assessing the damage and counting the cost of the destruction left in its wake.

One of the first steps to be taken if your property has been damaged in a natural disaster like this is to check what your insurance policy covers for storms and floods.

The Australian Securities and Investment Commission's MoneySmart service recommends dealing directly with your insurer or an authorised, trusted insurance broker or financial advisor for help with making a claim. Should you need emergency accommodation, your insurer may also be able to assist.

You may be asked to record or photograph damage of your property and to make a list of all the damage, including as much detail as possible.

Many policies require you to take reasonable steps to minimise the loss – for example, by placing a tarp over a broken roof to prevent further water damage, or moving undamaged items to a safe and secure place.

It's important to check with your insurer before making any repairs to your property, as they may need to authorise repairs and tradespeople before they happen.

Fake tradies and other types of scammers often target disaster affected areas, offering cheap, cash-only repairs to roofs, driveways and fences, so beware those who come to your door unannounced. Instead ask relatives, friends or social media connections for recommendations, get several quotes and sight previous work plus proof of any credential claims, such as evidence of an industry association membership.

We also have factsheets that provide advice on different scenarios from the rights and responsibilities of renters when there's damage at a rental home, to what to do if a home you are in a contract to buy was damaged during wild weather. Should you encounter difficulties relating to insurance claims, which you are unable to resolve directly with your insurer, you can lodge a complaint with the Australian Financial Complaints Authority (AFCA) – www.afca.org.au. If you've lost your insurance details, the Insurance Hotline can help on 1800 734 621.

Food coach with appetite for change wins award

Witnessing the effects food additives had on her own children inspired a Western Australian mother to create a movement that has been recognised in this year's Consumer Protection Awards.

Francine Bell of Additive Free Kids (AFK) won the 2021 Rona Okely Award for individuals in recognition of her tireless efforts to educate consumers about additives and how to make additive-free choices.

She does this by auditing ingredient and green/clean labels to cut through marketing tactics and claims, in order to identify the facts, which then allows consumers to make informed decisions about the food they eat.

This has led consumers to vote with their dollar – in some cases, sales of some products have plummeted, leading to those items being pulled from supermarket shelves altogether.

Another of the worthy winners in the 2021 Consumer Protection Awards was Melanie Mitchell, whose almost 3-year-old son Lachlan died after drowning in a backyard pool at a family day care (FDC) centre in 2015. She won the Kidsafe WA Award for her work in lobbying for a ban on swimming pools at FDCs under the banner of 'Lachlan's Legacy' and as an ambassador for Royal Life Saving Society Australia.

Women's Legal Service WA of Perth was awarded the Richard (Dick) Fletcher Award for its work providing support, advice and legal assistance to women.

The Ruby Hutchison Media Award went to Gary Adshead, from 9News Perth, for his story on the tow truck industry that highlighted the dishonest tactics used by some operators to gain business from consumers involved in motor vehicle accidents.

This year's awards have been a wonderful opportunity to acknowledge the fantastic achievements of people in the community who are helping consumers and tenants overcome difficulties and promoting their rights.

Australian Government assistance for Tropical Cyclone Seroja

Australian Government support payments activated for Western Australia Tropical Cyclone Seroja.

Quickest and easiest way to claim is to call **180 22 66**.

Phone line is open now, eligible recipients can claim today.

The Australian Government has extended the Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment (AGDRP) and Disaster Recovery Allowance (DRA) to support those heavily affected by Tropical Cyclone Seroja in Western Australia with over \$300,000 paid to cyclone affected to date.

People in the Carnamah, Chapman Valley, Greater Geraldton, Mingenew, Morawa, Perenjori and Three Springs local government areas can now access the support package

Federal Member for Durack, the Hon Melissa Price said that these communities have been left devastated following major damage to homes, businesses and resorts as a result of destructive winds from Ex-Tropical Cyclone Seroja.

"A lot of people are coming home to find their houses have been impacted or in some cases are completely uninhabitable so this funding is going to be crucial to get these communities back on their feet," Ms Price said.

Minister for Emergency Management David Littleproud said the package provided immediate assistance to those hit hardest by TC Seroja.

"The **AGDRP** provides a one-off payment of \$1,000 for eligible adults and \$400 for eligible children, who have been seriously injured and have had homes damaged or destroyed," Minister Littleproud said.

"These payments of \$1000 per eligible adult and \$400 per eligible child will help people to get through this difficult period with some dignity and the ability to meet their most immediate needs.

"Up to 13 weeks of income support is also available through the **DRA** to support those people whose place of work has been affected or can't get to work.

"We have extended this assistance to seven more local government areas based on further impact data that the Western Australian government has provided to us."

Minister for Government Services, Linda Reynolds, said Services Australia staff have mobilised and are providing immediate on-the-ground support to people affected by the devastating cyclone in Western Australia.

‘Supporting communities through crisis is what Services Australia is geared to do and we have a dedicated Mobile Service Team to support residents with the current disaster response effort,’ Minister for Government Services Linda Reynolds said.

‘There may be some disruption at Services Australia service centres in affected areas over coming days. We ask that people who use these services to access them via online or over the phone where possible. I urge people to heed local emergency services warnings and do not travel unless safe to do so.

‘Services Australia staff on the phones are on standby ready to help affected residents. The fastest and easiest way to claim disaster assistance is by calling the Disaster Assistance phone line on 180 22 66.

Services Australia Disaster Assistance phone lines are open from 8:00am to 5:00pm local time, Monday to Friday, and 9am to 5pm local time, Saturday to Sunday. For more information on support available, visit servicesaustralia.gov.au/disaster.

People eligible for DRA can access income assistance for up to 13 weeks, equivalent to the maximum rate of Jobseeker Payment or Youth Allowance.

Equivalent financial assistance will also be available to eligible New Zealand citizens (‘non-protected’ Special Category Visa, subclass 444 holders) affected by Tropical Cyclone Seroja.

The Australia Government will continue assessing the impacts of the disaster and will offer further support if necessary.

“Ms Price said that in addition to the core site at the Merredin Dryland Research Institute, regional nodes will be located in Carnarvon, Geraldton, Northam, Bunbury, Manjimup, Albany, Katanning and Esperance. This will provide extra shopfronts and increase the reach to farmers and communities with boots on the ground and creating jobs in the regions.

“The Hub will bring together organisations like Mingenew Irwin Group, WA Farmers, Farmers2Founders, Australian Women Wheatbelt East and Wheatbelt Development Commission with universities.”

Minister for Agriculture, Drought and Emergency Management David Littleproud said the South West Western Australia Hub is one of eight across the country to be established that will support development and uptake of innovative technologies and practices that improve drought resilience.
