Venus & the Crescent | 12th June



Venus and our crescent moon will appear quite close to one another in the early evening sky this month. The moon will be extremely thin, only about 3% illuminated, while Venus will be almost full, about 95% illuminated. Small wide-field telescopes may be able to squeeze both objects into the field of view at the same time!

When to look: Just after sunset, 12th June

Which direction to look: Low to the west

SOMETHING INTERESTING

The craters along the light and dark sides of the moon (a line known as the terminator) always appear more pronounced when viewed through a telescope. This is because of the angle the sun's light makes with the lunar surface at this boundary area. If you stood on the terminator of the Moon, the Sun would appear very low to the horizon and your shadow would be very long, just like on Earth. These long shadows make lunar surface features like craters and mountains much more pronounced.

New guide addresses building fee increases, delays

Building a new home can be an exciting time, but many Western Australians going through the process right now may be facing unexpected price rises and construction delays.

To help set the record straight on when prices can and cannot be increased, our colleagues at Building and Energy have published a new guide outlining what builders and their clients need to know about home building contract work valued between \$7,500 and \$500,000.

Generally a builder cannot increase a fixed-price contract unless the reason is outside of their control, such as the consumer failing to get finance approval in time or a natural disaster holding up the build.

This means that any increases in building material prices should not be passed on to the consumer, nor should they bear the cost of delays caused by labour shortages.

The guide covers the options available to consumers if they are unable to pay a legitimate cost increase, and what the law says about building work not completed within the timeframe specified in the contract.

For consumers who believe a price increase is excessive or unjustified, or those who may have agreed to an increase before understanding their rights, advice is provided on how they can dispute the additional charges.

Guidance is given about how a builder should approach cost variations and why a consumer may have only 10 business days to dispute such an increase.

Building and Energy urges consumers to research their rights under WA's home building contract laws and to talk to their builders to understand the reasons for the price rise.

Consumers should also ask if there is an obligation they have not met and seek to understand why the delay is outside of the builder's control.

Warm up safely this winter

Winter is here, so consumers are being reminded to stay safe when using products like hot water bottles, which cause serious burns to hundreds of Australians each year.

One of the most recent cases involved a 20-year-old man from Melbourne who was treated in hospital for second and third degree burns to his hands and thighs when a hot water bottle burst on his lap.

A reason why hot water bottles can pose a safety risk is that the rubber or polyvinyl chloride (PVC) they're made from can break or deteriorate over time, so it's important to regularly check for wear and tear.

Only ever use hot tap water, never boiling water, and avoid contact with the skin once filled by using a fitted cover or wrap. They should also never be used for a baby, nor left on one body part for longer than 20 minutes.

It's worth checking the Product Safety site for recalls – for example one range is currently being recalled due to concerns the stopper could leak or the seams could split.

Should you use electric blankets, check that cords haven't frayed and the blanket still adequately covers any wiring. Also remember to turn them off before getting into bed, and seek advice from your health practitioner before using one if you are pregnant or have diabetes.

Elsewhere in the home, it's important to regularly check your smoke alarms are still functioning and make sure the chimney is clean and properly ventilated before using a fireplace.

Children should never be left unattended around candles and be protected from the dangers of button batteries by ensuring electronic devices have secure battery compartments.

Multiple children are admitted to hospital every year with burns sustained from their clothing catching fire, so it's important to keep them away from open heat sources, like fireplaces and heaters.

Be aware that a combination of heavy rainfall, cold temperatures and heaters can lead to mould growth, which may cause health problems. Any mould needs to be removed and the area kept ventilated to avoid regrowth.

Safety First in Durack

1 June 2021

The Morrison Government is providing up to \$20 million in funding for early intervention projects and up to \$10 million for security infrastructure through Round Six of the Safer Communities Fund.

The Federal Member for Durack, the Hon. Melissa Price said this funding will help ensure people in our local community feel safe as they go about their daily lives.

"We'll continue to work closely with local councils and community organisations to identify infrastructure projects that can be supported through this funding," Ms Price said.

"There are two streams to this funding round, with the early intervention funding stream providing support for at risk young people to help them turn away from crime and build positive relationships and skills. The infrastructure stream will support funding applications to improve security and protect communities through projects such as CCTV, fencing and bollards," she said.

The *early intervention* grant opportunity is open today, closing 22 July 2021.

The security *infrastructure* grant opportunity opens on 15 June 2021, closing 5 August 2021.

"Durack communities have really benefited from previous rounds of the Safer Communities Fund, including almost \$3 million to assist Police and Community Youth Centres in Broome, Geraldton, Carnarvon and Roebourne," Ms Price said.

Grant opportunity guidelines for the early intervention and infrastructure funding streams will be available on the opening dates at www.business.gov.au. Guidelines will include information about how to apply, eligibility and assessment criteria.

The Morrison Government announced \$35 million (including program administration costs) from 2020-21 to 2023-24 to fund round six of the Safer Communities Fund in Budget 2020-21.

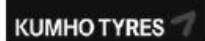

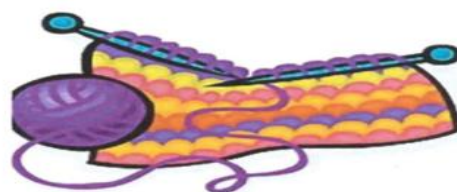
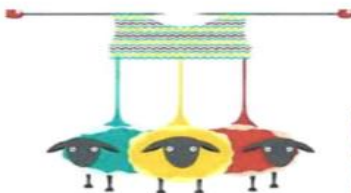

Disbursements to begin for people with homes destroyed by Tropical Cyclone Seroja

Payments of \$25,000 will be made available for every house classified as totally destroyed following Tropical Cyclone Seroja cutting a path of destruction through Mid-West communities last month.

A further \$10,000 is also available for every property assessed to have suffered major damage making it uninhabitable, such as loss of roofs.

The amounts apply to both owner/occupiers and tenants of properties at the time the tropical cyclone struck and all affected properties must be the primary place of residence.

A team on behalf of the Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund (The Fund) will travel to the affected region on Monday to support and assist local governments in establishing the application process.

The Tropical Cyclone Seroja Appeal has swelled to \$7.2million following a further \$500,000 donation from the Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund Board today.

A number of major corporations have also added to the total, including; Coles (\$153,185), Crown Perth (\$150,000) and the Stan Perron Charitable Foundation (\$100,000).

Presiding Chair Lord Mayor Basil Zempilas visited the region today, along with Emergency Services Minister Reece Whitby.

Mr Zempilas said the generosity of West Australians and West Australian companies continued to shine through for the people in the Mid-West affected by this disaster.

"We know that this disaster caused catastrophic damage for many West Australians across a massive area," he said.

"We all saw the pictures from Kalbarri and Northampton, but residents from many more towns and farms in the region saw their homes destroyed and damaged.

"Many people in the region still don't have power to the homes yet and are doing it tough.

"While I understand these payments will not replace everything that people have lost, I hope that it will ease some of the financial burden.

"This Fund is unique in that every dollar the WA community has donated will go directly to the people and communities affected by this tropical cyclone.

"As the Presiding Chair of the Fund, I was pleased to announce that the Board had agreed to donate a further \$500,000, bringing the Board's total donation to \$1 million"

The 13 Local Government Authorities in the region will work with the Fund to assess and review all applications and help disburse money as soon as possible.

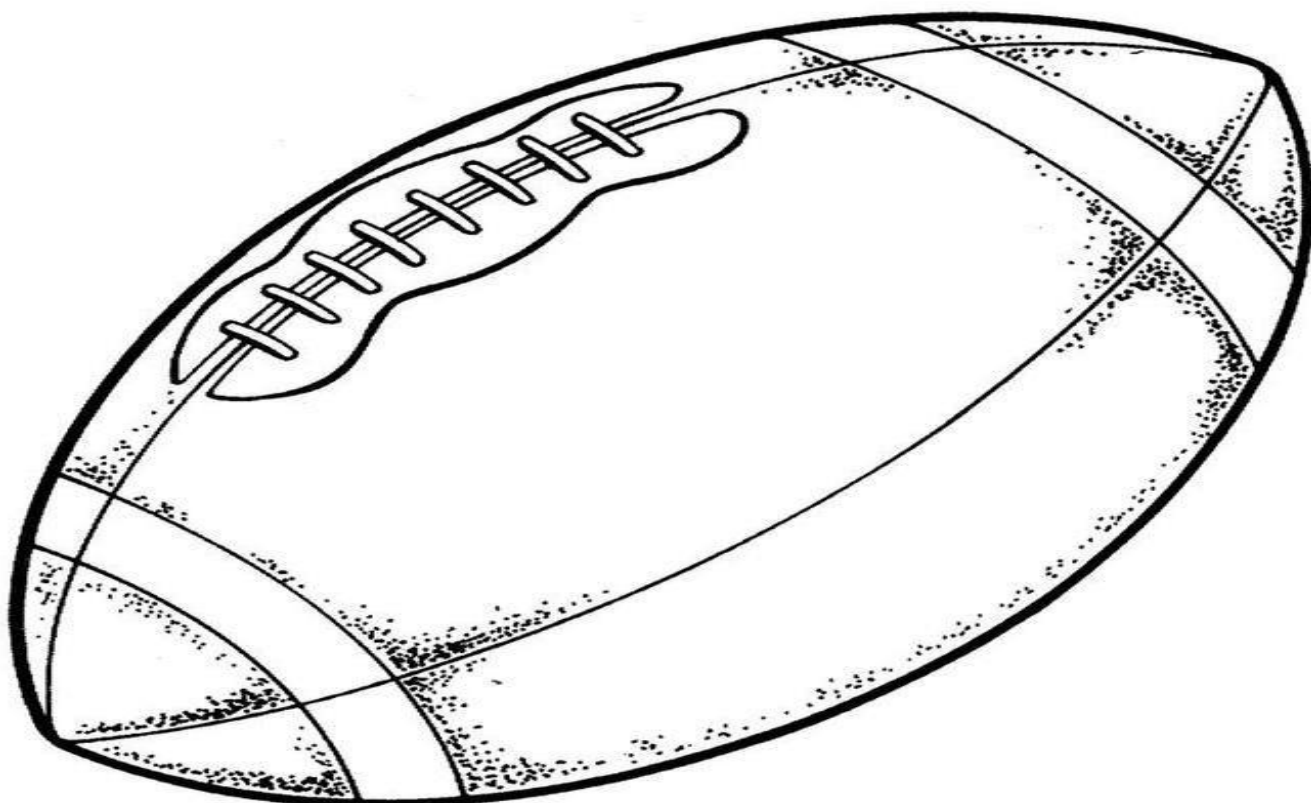
