Extra time to apply for rent relief

As the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic continues to cast a shadow over our lives, there may be some Western Australians who are still struggling to stay afloat financially due to job losses or having their work hours reduced.

Renters who are unemployed, or who have lost more than half their income, should know that the State Government's Residential Rent Relief Grant scheme will now remain open until the end of the year.

Originally due to close on 28 June 2021, the existing scheme has so far made around 8,300 grant payments worth more than \$11.6 million to help struggling tenants and their landlords.

Extending the program to 31 December 2021 will provide further targeted assistance for those tenants in financial hardship, including those who rely on Centrelink as a primary income.

We're aware that rental prices have risen right across the state. Tenants who are struggling financially and facing a significant rent increase may be eligible to receive a rent support grant. The grant offers up to \$2,000 per tenancy, so long as their landlord agrees to a lease of at least six months.

Other tenants may be in rental arrears, in which case they could be entitled to have up to 75 per cent of the debt – up to a maximum of \$4,000 – paid directly to eligible landlords. In return, the landlord and tenant must enter into a minimum six-month lease agreement.

Even though some tenants may fit the criteria for both rent arrears assistance and rent support, it's important to know that they cannot receive both grants. In this situation, our processing officer will work out which grant will be of the greatest benefit, and this will be paid to the landlord on the applicant's behalf.

Previous grant applicants can apply again under the extended scheme if they are still struggling financially due to COVID-19.

Renters entitled to timely repairs

There's no place like home, so when unexpected damage occurs to a rental property it's important for tenants to be across their rights and know that they can come to us when issues aren't fixed in a reasonable time.

Regardless of whether damage to a rental property occurs due to wild weather or a structural issue, the landlord is legally responsible for necessary repairs and maintenance to bring the property back to a liveable condition.

Consumer Protection recently became aware of one family who had been living under a tarpaulin for three weeks after a large part of their rental property's ceiling spontaneously collapsed, and we are currently helping the parties to reach an agreement.

Issues that could damage the property or cause someone harm or undue hardship require landlords and property managers to initiate urgent repairs within 48 hours. For damage to essential services, like water, gas electricity or sewerage, the time limit is 24 hours. If damage to the property has reduced the facilities available, tenants may be entitled to a rent reduction.

If no action is taken, the tenant may serve a notice for the repairs to be carried out as soon as practicable, or they may directly employ a suitably qualified repairer to carry out the works to a minimum standard, with the landlord being required to reimburse them for the costs.

Should the landlord fail to cover these costs, the tenant can apply to the Magistrates Court for an order. For this reason, tenants should keep receipts and a record of contact with the landlord.

We know that travelling conmen target storm-damaged areas, so both tenants and landlords should avoid employing tradespeople who contact them out of the blue offering to complete work at cheap rates.

Bank closures a failure to support regional communities

Nationals Wheatbelt MPs have expressed disappointment at the National Australia Bank (NAB)'s decision to close up shop in Three Springs, Wyalkatchem, Kondinin and Wagin.

Moore MP Shane Love said the announcement was a blow to the communities who relied on the bank's presence for their financial services, including household, business, and personal transactions.

"During a time of uncertainty, with a pandemic, significant weather events, and growing housing and health crises, this news adds insult to injury to regional West Australians," Mr Love said.

Mr Love said decisions like this were out of step with community expectations.

"NAB's decision based on decline in foot-traffic through the affected branches shows an organisation unable to adapt to changing circumstances such as a global pandemic and a callous approach to supporting communities during a time of need," Mr Love said.

"In the wake of the Royal Commission into the banking sector which included investigation into the culture and governance of banks and financial institutions, you'd think there'd be thought given to more than the bottom line for services like this.

"I know they're not the only major bank to withdraw services from small country communities, but it's a bit rich to suggest they're making the decision off a decline in foot traffic in branches over the past 12 months."

Mr Love said the news was a huge blow to the community especially after parts of the Midwest and Wheatbelt were continuing to deal with the aftermath of Cyclone Seroja.

"There are many areas, people, homes and businesses that were badly affected by the cyclone – it is well-known the widespread rebuilding effort could take years," he said.

"Now is an ideal time for banks to be on the ground providing much-needed support for those experiencing devastating losses and a lack of State Government assistance.

"Banks need to have a presence in these communities to understand their situation, and instead of closing doors based on algorithms, these organisations should work humanely and lend a helping hand wherever needed."

Cheers to Cheaper Power for Durack Hotels

Major Project Status to Durack Potash Project 29 June 2021

The Morrison Government is supporting development of a major potash production and export project in a remote part of Western Australia's Pilbara, expected to bring hundreds of jobs to the region.

Federal Member for Durack, the Hon. Melissa Price has welcomed the project's recognition of Major Project Status.

"It emphasises the importance of the project to Australia's economy and exports and will help the project deal with Government approvals for this crucial agricultural fertiliser ingredient," Ms Price said.

Reward Minerals has been granted the status for its \$450 million Lake Disappointment Brine and Sulphate of Potash project, located about 320 kilometres east of Newman in northern Western Australia.

"It is expected that the Durack project will produce around 400,000 tonnes of sulphate of potash a year from mining and brine evaporation facilities at Lake Disappointment, providing employment of 230 jobs during construction and 200 direct jobs during operations," she said.

Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, Christian Porter has also welcomed this decision.

"The Lake Disappointment project will strengthen the security of Australia's agriculture sector and support the Government's Ag2030 agenda to boost Australia's agricultural production to \$100 billion a year by 2030 once completed," he said.

The Lake Disappointment project has an initial life of 25 years. The project is also expected to create new opportunities to export potash to expanding markets in Southeast Asia, India and potentially East Africa.

Major Project Status helps companies access extra support, coordination, and information services from the Major Projects Facilitation Agency which acts as a single-entry point into the Australian Government regulatory approvals pathway.



Venus - A Strange World Indeed


Astronomers often refer to Venus as the nearest thing to hell in our Solar System! It is the hottest planet with a scorching surface temperature of about 470°c, even hotter than Mercury which is closer to the Sun!

The thick cloud cover, made of sulphuric acid and carbon dioxide, traps the heat onto the surface, creating a runaway greenhouse atmosphere. The intense pressure of the atmosphere is 90 times that of Earth, so standing on Venus would feel as if you were 900m deep in an ocean.

Venus spins the opposite way to Earth, so the Sun rises in the west and sets in the east. Even more curious, because of its slow rotation, its day is longer than its year! A day on Venus takes 243 Earth days and one year is equal to 224 days.

Venus is the brightest planet to see in the sky due to that thick cloud cover, reflecting back about 70% of the sunlight striking it. |

So, from down here on Earth, Venus appears to be a beautiful and sparkling world!
