Look for flexibility when booking travel

Just when many Western Australians may have thought it was safe to book domestic travel, a series of COVID-19 outbreaks have led to interstate lockdowns and tighter border controls.

If your travel plans have been grounded by the latest round of restrictions, then hopefully a refund or credit note was sorted quickly. If not, you're far from alone. Since COVID-19 started impacting Western Australia in March 2020, Consumer Protection has received nearly 1,200 complaints and 1,340 enquiries from people with travel-related issues.

When the cancellation of travel services occurs due to government restrictions, consumers may not be automatically entitled to the same remedy options, such as a refund, as they would be in normal circumstances under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL).

Before booking travel, it's important to carefully consider what the terms and conditions (T&Cs) say about cancellations or postponement, and think about what your options might be if border restrictions remain or are reimposed before or during the dates of travel. For this reason, cheaper options for travel bookings may not be the best choice under current circumstances as they may be quite restrictive on what, if any, remedies are offered if there is a need to change your plans. In the current circumstances, our advice is to look for the most flexible booking arrangements with the best refund options.

If you have booked travel to a jurisdiction where there is a sudden lockdown, don't immediately cancel your travel arrangements. Firstly speak to your travel or accommodation provider to see what they are planning to do. Cancelling in advance of a decision by your travel provider might be treated as a 'change of mind' by you and your cancellation options may be significantly reduced.

Booking future travel can be risky due to the ongoing and evolving nature of the pandemic. A safer option currently is intra-state travel, however we would advise booking within WA close to the date of travel, and continue to be wary of 'pay now/book later' deals that may impact your ability to get a refund.

Don't get infected by FluBot

If you've been bombarded with suspicious, garbled text messages lately that mention a missed call or voicemail, you're not alone.

There's a good chance that the messages riddled with typos have been generated by malware called FluBot, which tries to steal Android device users' banking details and other personal information.

We understand the scammers behind the malware are deliberately using bad grammar and spelling errors in the text messages to circumvent strict filters put in place by telco companies that would ordinarily block this type of message from getting through.

The FluBot malware has already infected devices in Europe, after Android users clicked on the links in the messages and installed the FluBot app, which is only available outside of the official Google PlayStore.

Even though iPhones can still receive the messages, the FluBot malware doesn't pose a threat to iOS users because they can only download and install files directly from the Apple store.

Once installed on an Android device, the FluBot can take over to spy and steal data. Of particular concern is its ability to overlay on top of a legitimate banking app, leading the victim to a scammer's site instead of their own bank. FluBot can also access your contact list, meaning your friends and family may also start receiving the bogus messages.

While phishing scams aren't new, they are on the rise. New figures from WA ScamNet reveal that so far in 2021, 81 victims have lost more than \$904,000 to phishing scams, compared to 65 victims with almost \$305,000 in losses for the whole of 2020.

Our best advice is to never click on links in messages you are not expecting, don't download apps outside of official app stores and consider installing anti-virus software on your Android phone.

If you have installed the FluBot app, it is recommended to do a factory reset on your device to remove the malware. Avoid doing a 'restore' on your phone to retrieve lost apps and files, as this may reinstate the malware.

Successful feral pig aerial cull highlights alarming population

A feral pig aerial monitoring surveillance and culling activity was recently conducted in early July in the Morawa and Mingenew areas as part of the Midlands Biosecurity Group (MBG) and Central Wheat belt Biosecurity Association's (CWBA) collaborative Morawa Mingenew Feral Pig Project.

The aerial shoot culled 466 feral pigs and identified many of the sows were in pig, highlighting the breeding potential of these animals.

While a good result, the number of feral pigs being spotted and eradicated from this area continues to be alarming.

It is estimated that if the aerial cull had not gone ahead and no further control completed, by early 2022 feral pig numbers in that region alone would have been well over 5000.

Coral Coast Helicopters was contracted to implement this activity which was coordinated and overseen by MBG Licensed Pest Management Technician, Paul Pitaro.

Paul is working with both biosecurity groups to support landholders in coordinated control efforts and has been baiting pigs since February this year. Paul estimates a total of 292 pigs have been baiting across the shires of Mingenew and Morawa so far.

Further to this, the MBG has culled 564 feral pigs in other parts of the Midlands region (Badgingarra, Three Springs and Irwin), however there is still much work to be done.

MBG coordinator Chris O'Callaghan believes it will be an ongoing biosecurity battle throughout the region as the effort required to stay on top of these numbers is considerable.

"The MBG is receiving reports of feral pigs in areas where there hasn't been any before, possibly due to a combination of recent control activity, favourable weather conditions and hunting activities," said Chris.

"There are not many places in the region that aren't reporting any feral pig activity, and the rate at which they can breed and spread means that if landholders aren't seeing them now then they will be vulnerable to them in the future."

"This is why a co-ordinated response is required as the numbers are quite concerning," said Chris.

The MBG is running Feral Pest Workshops across the region this September.

Activity Notice

Airborne Electromagnetic Survey - Murchison River Area

Geoscience Australia, in collaboration with The Geological Survey of Western Australia (GSWA), is carrying out an airborne electromagnetic (AEM) survey across a large area in the west of Western Australia.

AEM surveys are widely used for groundwater mapping, as well as for mineral and energy resources exploration. This survey will provide regional data coverage for more informed natural resource management and better focussed exploration investment. The survey is funded via the Western Australian Government's Exploration Incentive Scheme.

AEM survey method

Aircraft fitted with electromagnetic instruments map variations in the electrical conductivity of the ground to a depth of several hundred metres without any ground disturbance.

What you may see




Figure 1: Picture of the AEM system from the ground.

A helicopter, towing equipment below it, will make a single pass approximately 100 m above the ground, along tracks 20 km apart (see Figure 1). If you have any concerns with this activity, please make further enquiries via one of the contacts listed below.

COVID-19 Protocols

The survey will be conducted in accordance with relevant state and national restrictions regarding Covid-19. No ground disturbance will occur within the survey area.

Spica Stars! | 6th & 21st September



Spica is the brightest star in the constellation of Virgo, and this September its lucky enough to have two planetary guests! On the 6th and 21st of September, both Venus and Mercury will make close approaches to this star respectively.

When to look: Just after sunset on the 6th and 21st September

Which direction to look: West











Finding the Scorpius Constellation

Learning to point out constellations is lots of fun, and one of the easiest to find is Scorpius the Scorpion. It's a lovely, large constellation that really does form the shape of a scorpion! It is currently visible throughout the evening, lying directly overhead at around 8pm.

When and where to look: A great night to find Scorpio will be on the 10th September. Look for a brilliant conjunction of Venus and the crescent Moon in the north-west at sunset. Higher in the sky look for a reddish star, Antares that lies in the centre of the constellation, known as the heart of the scorpion. See if you can find the curve of Scorpio's body and the sting in its tail stretching up to the centre of the sky!

Antares is a super-giant red star several hundred times the diameter of our Sun and is about 550 light-years from Earth. It is often referred to as the 'Heart of the Scorpion', due to its location in the constellation and its reddish glow. The name Antares means 'rival of Mars' due to its similarity in colour. It is classified as a Red Supergiant and is massive, at approximately 700 times our sun's diameter!


