

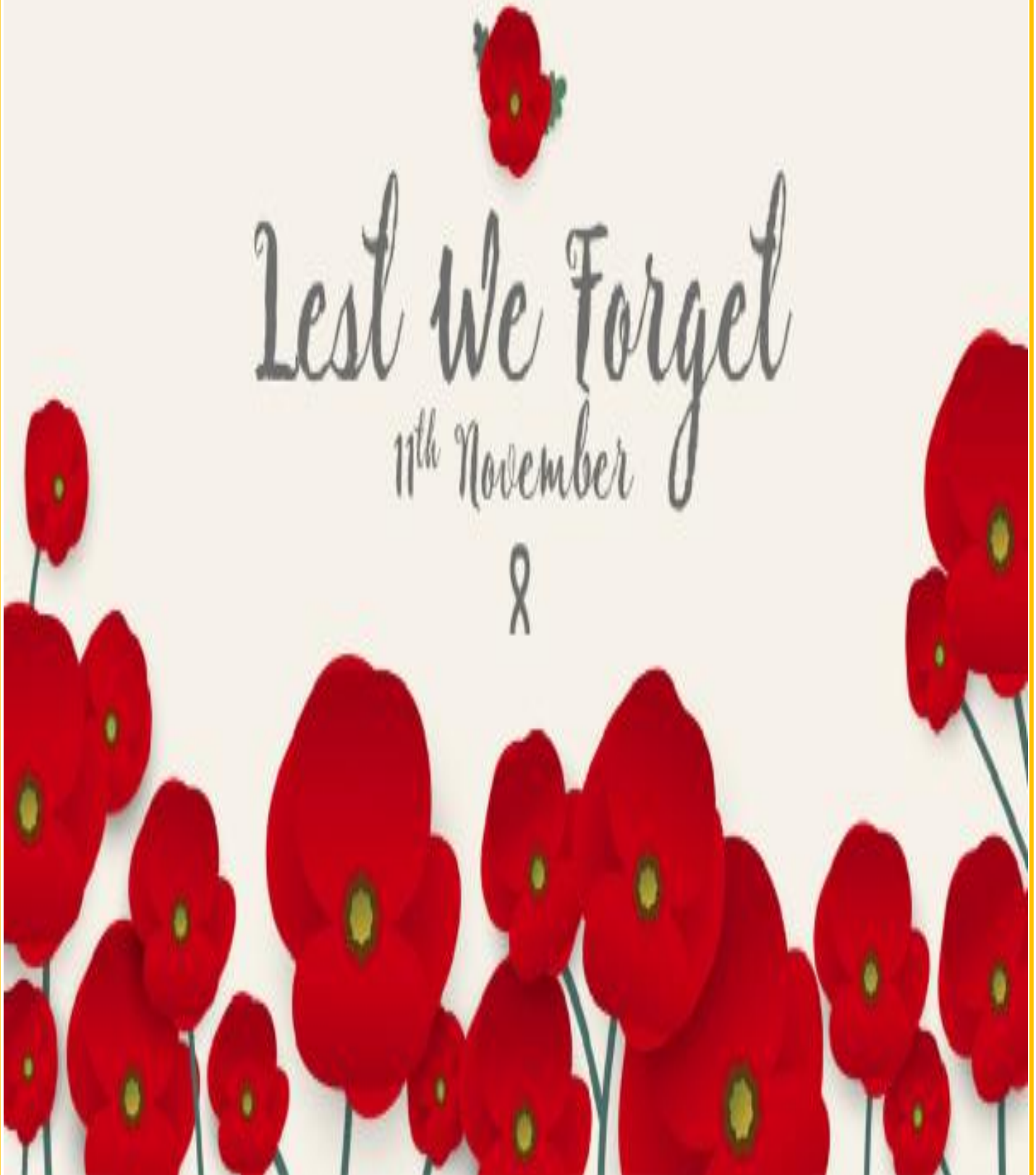

Construct a 10m wide mineral earth firebreak with a vertical clearance of 4m high; clear of all inflammable material immediately surrounding the plantation (adjacent areas of the same property subject to provisions as for rural land)

Plantations larger than 10 hectares

Fire Break Notice Section 33 B F A

Prohibited Burning Period

1st November to 28th February

STRICTLY NO BURNING

Restricted Burning Period

15th October to 31st October

1st March to 15th March

PERMITS ARE REQUIRED



FIRST AND FINAL notice is hereby served to all residents and ratepayers

Failure to install and maintain firebreaks in accordance with this notice may result in a \$5,000 fine.

Failure to maintain a firebreak as per firebreak order	\$250
Offence relating to lighting a fire in the open air	\$250
Setting fire to bush during prohibited burning period	\$250
Failure of Occupier to extinguish a bushfire	\$250
Refusal to state name and abode or stating a false name and abode	\$100
Failure to produce permit to burn	\$100

Fire Control Officers are not obliged to issue

permits. Permits cannot be issued over the phone and should a Fire Control Officer refuse to issue a permit, it is a breach of the Bush Fires Act 1954 to request a permit from another Fire Control Officer.

You **MUST** have a copy of the permit on you during the burn

Harvesting Operations

No harvesting operations are permitted on **Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Years Day**. A separate fire fighting fire appliance is required to be present in any paddock being harvested, churning, raking stubble, straw baling and associated allied activities during restricted and prohibited periods. The fire fighting unit must be in a state of readiness and have a minimum capacity of 400 litres of water, a powered pump and at least 15 metres of hose with a minimum diameter of 19 mm and capable of delivering water through an adjustable nozzle is to be readily available to any paddock being harvested. All vehicles or machinery operating in a paddock during Restricted or Prohibited burning times must have a Fire Extinguisher as defined in the Act. A Fire Extinguisher means a device which comprises— a. a container filled with at least 7.5 litres of water and a pump capable of discharging that water, and which is in a sound and efficient condition.

A Harvesting and Movement Ban and Use of Internal Combustion Engines (except for the watering and movement of stock) will be imposed when the actual weather conditions reach a Fire Danger rating of thirty five (35). All such bans are at the discretion of the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer or a duly appointed person

Note – Attention of landowners is drawn to the fact that this order allows for provision of firebreaks in situations other than immediately with property boundaries subject to approval. The Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and appointed Fire Control Officers have been authorised to act for Council in this matter

Failure to install and maintain firebreaks in accordance with this Notice may result in a \$5,000 fine.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954 AS AMENDED

Notice is hereby given to all landowners/occupiers within the Shire of Three Springs that fire-breaks must be installed on or by 1st October and maintained of flammable material up to and including 15th March as per requirements in relation to Section 33 of the above

PROPERTIES WILL BE INSPECTED TO ENSURE THEY COMPLY WITH COUNCILS REQUIREMENTS

1. TOWNSITES

On or before 1st October all town lots within the town sites of Three Springs and Arrino are required to be treated as follows. Where the area of land is less than 3,000m², the property must be cleared, mowed, slashed to a MAXIMUM height of 7.5 cm of all flammable material.

Where the area of the land is 3,000m² or more, a firebreak must be provided not less than 3 metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied and all flammable material must be cleared a distance of 2.7m from all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land and maintained free of such material until the 15th March.

FUEL STORAGE AREAS

On or before the 1st October all grass and similar material is to be cleared from such places where drum ramps are located and where drums, empty or full, are stored and such areas to be maintained cleared of grass and similar flammable material until 15th March

FARM BUILDINGS AND UNATTENDED ELECTRIC MOTORS AND HAY STACKS

Fire breaks at least 3 metres in width completely surrounding and not more than 20 metres from the perimeter of any building, group of buildings or haystacks. All flammable material must be removed from an area 2.7 metres in width immediately surrounding the building. All flammable material must be removed from an area 3 metres in width immediately surrounding an unattended electric motor site

UNATTENDED FUEL OPERATED MOTORS

All flammable material must be removed from an area 3 metres in width immediately surrounding an unattended fuel operated motor whether the motor is intended to be used or not.

RURAL LAND

Firebreaks must be provided not less than 3 metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied; where this is not practicable the firebreaks must be provided as near as possible to, and within, such boundaries

BARBEQUES AND INCINERATORS

Gas and electric barbeques are permitted any time. Solid fuel barbeques and incinerators are PROHIBITED on days of VERY HIGH FIRE DANGER or above.

PENALTY

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of up to \$400 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or Occupier by the date required by this notice

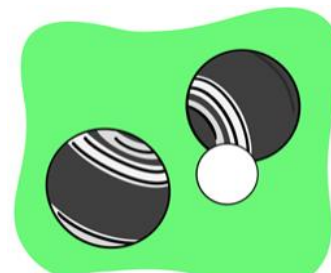

Get into Halloween spirit safely

With ghoulish costumes, sweet treats galore and frightfully fun decorations, Halloween has become increasingly popular in Australia over the last decade.

So if you're planning some Halloween fun with your family on 31 October, there are some things you can do to prevent it turning into Halloween hell.

If you want to add some extra ghoul to your family's costumes with fake tattoos, face paint, makeup or fake blood, check they come with ingredients labels and keep them handy throughout the night. In case someone in your group has an allergic reaction to a product, having a list of ingredients available can save doctors vital time when determining how to treat them.

[Wearing black or other dark coloured costumes for Halloween means you or your children could be hard to see in the dark.](#) To ensure drivers and other trick-or-treaters can see you, carry a torch and consider adding glow sticks or a reflective strip to your costumes.

It goes without saying that people would want their costumes to have a low risk of catching fire, especially with jack-o-lanterns out in full force. The best way to ensure costumes, wigs and other accessories are a low fire risk is to look for labels that state the product is 'flame resistant' or 'fire resistant'.

Avoid products that carry warnings such as 'keep away from flame' or 'Warning! Keep away from fire'. [Also avoid loose fitting costumes, particularly if you or your children will be around candles.](#)

When buying light up or musical Halloween novelties that are powered by button batteries, you should check the battery compartment is secured with a screw or similar fastener to prevent children gaining access to the battery.

The statistics on button batteries aren't pretty, with one child a month sustaining a serious injury from swallowing or inserting button batteries. Products that comply with mandatory standards designed to keep children safe will have secure battery compartments and safety labelling.

Tips to buy a used car privately

If you're gearing up to buy a used car, you might be thinking about whether to go through a private seller rather than a licensed dealership.

While buying a vehicle privately can be cheaper, it also offers less security, so it's important to know what steps to take to avoid ending up with a lemon or being scammed out of your money altogether.

Consumer Protection has published a new video covering the various things to bear in mind, including how vehicles purchased through private sellers are not covered by a statutory warranty, meaning it's a good idea to have it inspected at your own cost prior to purchase.

Depending on the age of the vehicle, you may also be entitled to any remaining period of the manufacturer's warranty, or any extended warranty that was purchased with the vehicle. Be sure to confirm whether any warranty remains and, if so, arrange with the seller to have it transferred where possible.

Although the Australian Consumer Law provides guarantees as to clear title, undisturbed possession and undisclosed securities, you should still carry out a search of the Personal Property Securities Register (PPSR) to ensure that the vehicle is not stolen, does not have money owing on it or is not a write-off.

When inspecting the vehicle, check the following information:

- Date and year of manufacture is the same as the date on the vehicle identification plate;
- The number plate matches that stated on the licence papers;
- Date and year of manufacture is the same as the date on the vehicle identification plate;
- The vehicle identification number or chassis number in the engine bay matches that stated on the licence registration papers;
- The vehicle is licensed, and when the licence expires; proof that the person selling the car is the owner, i.e. they have the vehicle licence papers, a sales receipt or driver's licence to help identify who they are.

A price and a method of payment needs to be agreed upon between yourself and the seller, and only proceed if you are completely happy with the purchase.

Stronger Communities Funding Round 7 opens in Durack

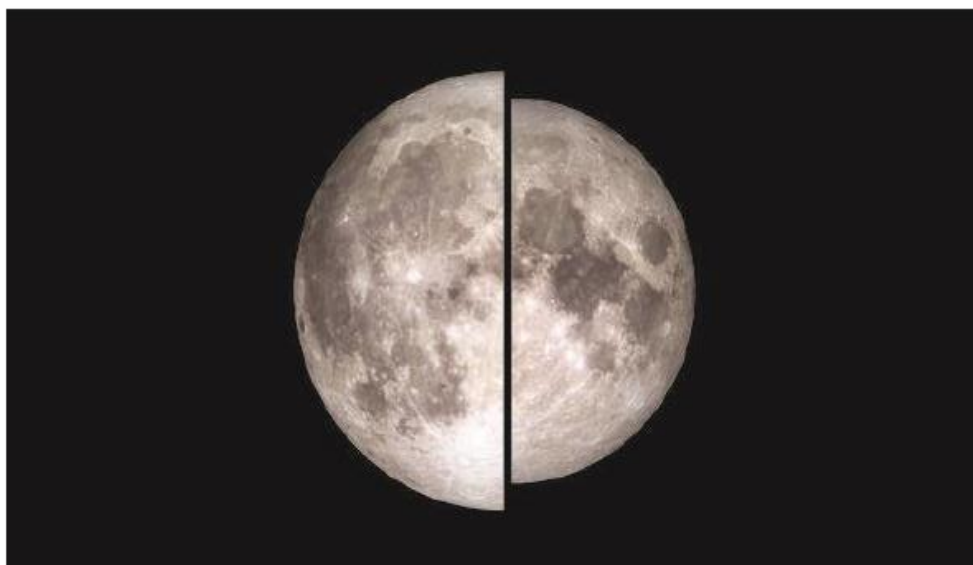
Supermoons and Minimoons

The Moon's orbit around Earth is slightly oval shaped or elliptical. So, every month there's a time when the Moon is at its closest distance to Earth at about 363,300 kilometres away, known as perigee and another time when it is at its furthest distance from Earth at about 405,500 kilometres away and known as apogee.

When perigee coincides with the full Moon, it's popularly called a "Supermoon". And when the full Moon coincides with apogee? Well, it's a "Micromoon" or a "Minimoon"!

When the Moon is at its closest it will appear 17 percent bigger and 30 percent brighter than a Minimoon.

You can spot a Minimoon on the 19th November. Looking to the east, moonrise will occur at 7.06pm and on this night the moon will be furthest away from Earth in its orbit. Check it out to see if you think the Moon looks smaller than normal.

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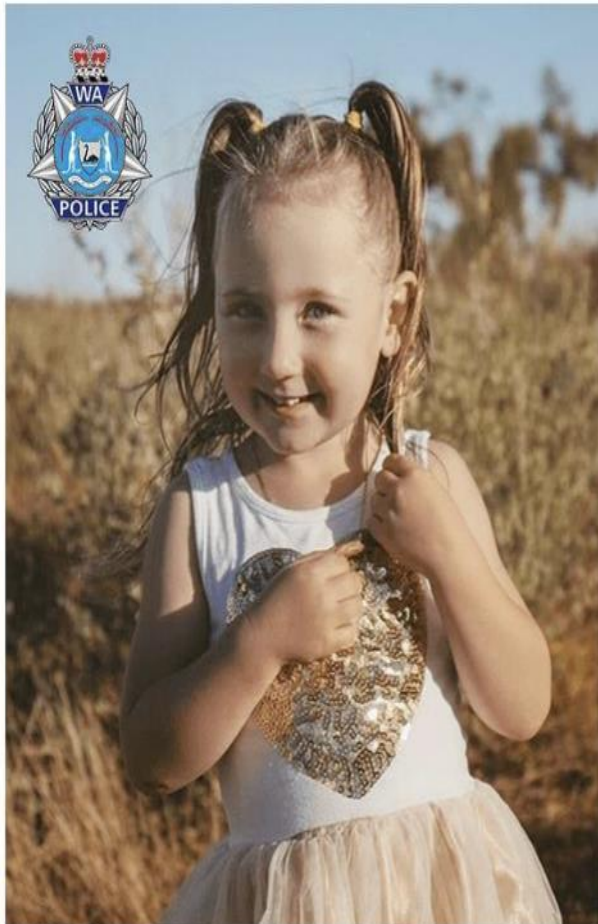
