A post-mortem on the high cost of dying

Losing a loved-one is a distressing experience, so the last thing vulnerable friends and relatives need at this time is to be confused over the cost of organising a funeral.

Unfortunately we've been made aware that some unscrupulous funeral service operators have used high-pressure marketing tactics to sell packages that don't reveal the true cost of individual items, some of which could be considered optional extras.

Investigations by the ACCC and CHOICE into misleading practices relating to 'bundled packages', pricing and contracts, revealed friends and relatives of the deceased often did not understand all of the costs involved and paid much more than they were initially led to believe.

Not being able to access pricing information upfront makes it difficult for consumers already grappling with grief to be able to compare prices on funerals or work-out if they are being overcharged.

That's why new regulations are being proposed that would require funeral companies to publicly display upfront price information that is clear and transparent, so that those organising the funeral don't need to meet with a representative to obtain this information.

It is believed this next step in the current reform of funeral industry pricing practices would make it easier for consumers to make an informed choice about which funeral provider to use.

Consumer Protection is now seeking feedback on a draft code of practice for funeral pricing via its [website](#), where consumers and industry are invited to have their say and share their experiences via a short survey or formal submission by Thursday 21 April 2022.

This current funeral pricing consultation follows the introduction last year of a mandatory [Prepaid Funerals Code of Practice](#) that requires all goods and services to be detailed in the contract, prices to be fixed at the time of signing and a 30-day cooling off period. The Code also requires payments to prepaid funeral funds be managed within secure investments under the name of the client until they are required.

Durack Shires To Benefit from Another Cash Boost

5 April 2022

Durack Shires will share in the Morrison Government's \$2.1 billion pre-payment on next year's Financial Assistance Grant to all local governments across Australia.

Federal Member for Durack, the Hon. Melissa Price said this early payment will give every council in Durack access to funds to help manage the cumulative impacts and recovery from two years of COVID-19.

"The funding will target councils' top priorities and will ensure the needs of our local communities are met with early payment of 75% of councils' allocation for next year's Financial Assistance Grant 2022-23. These grants are untied, allowing councils to spend the grants according to local priorities," Ms Price said.

"Following the vote of confidence in Australia's regions by the Morrison Government's Budget 22-23, this will provide a vital boost for our local communities, backing local jobs and economic growth while delivering lasting upgrades that will benefit residents for years to come," Ms Price said.

"I work closely with the 41 hardworking shires in Durack, and I know this extra finance will assist many projects that are either partially funded or will be able to get started. Having met regularly with my new shires in Durack to determine their needs since the Durack boundary changes last August I know, for example, that the Chittering Shire will be able to put to good use their \$1.2 million and the Shire of Northam who will receive \$2.5 million," she said.

Councils are expected to receive this payment before the end of April.

1080 baiting: a must for pest control but a risk to domestic pets

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development advises that essential baiting programs using 1080 are carried out all year round across the state. While these programs are aimed at controlling wild dogs, foxes, feral cats, feral pigs and rabbits, they do pose a risk to domestic dogs.

Keeping your family's best friend safe is your responsibility. If you have to take your dog with you when you travel in WA's regional areas, keep it on a leash or use a muzzle. The safest option is to not take your dog at all, but leave it in the safe hands of a carer or at a boarding kennel.

1080 baiting is essential for pastoralists and farmers, and to conserve our wildlife. Without baiting, stock are targeted by wild dogs and can be killed, causing emotional and financial distress to producers. Introduced predators also eat many native fauna. Over the past 100 years, more mammals have become extinct in Australia than anywhere else in the world.

About 1080

1080 is a naturally occurring poison found in 40 plant species. Western Australia has 39 of the 40 plant species growing naturally in the south-west. Native species have developed a tolerance to 1080 making it a more selective poison pest control option. However, **your domestic pet is not safe without your help.**

Baiting of pastoral leases, Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) reserves, unallocated Crown Land and freehold farms can be carried out at any time. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You **must** exercise caution when working within or visiting these areas. Warning signs are placed at entrance points on all land where baiting is being carried out and at other relevant places where applicable on pastoral, DBCA, and unallocated Crown Land.

However, **do not rely upon the presence of warning signs.** Signage may not be in the immediate vicinity and can be weather damaged, removed or destroyed. 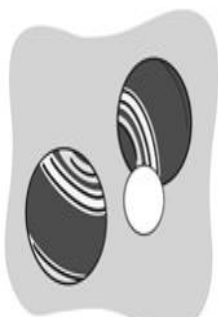
