## **ANZAC WEEKEND**

## THREE SPRINGS ARRINO, CARNAMAH & COOROW

On Sunday evening April 24<sup>th</sup> members of the RSL Sub Branch, Army vehicle drivers and guest speaker Bob Hunter travelled to the Coorow RSL hall for a short commemorative service. The flag was lowered to half mast, the Last Post played, a minute's silence, and the Ode recited. A very respectful acknowledgement for the veteran's from Coorow.

ANZAC Day morning service at Carnamah began with a flyover from Richard and Kevin in a Tiger Moth and an aerobatic vintage plane. Veterans and RSL members marched from the Gallery to the cenotaph area. Vintage jeeps and army vehicles from WW2 also took part in the march. Con Kikeros was the MC, and he recited the Ode of Remembrance. Warwick Trant and Brenda Bowman were our musicians. The ANZAC Requiem address was given by Mr Bob Hunter, a former SAS Squadron Commander. Emma Mondy travelled from Perth again this year for a live performance of The Last Post, and the Rouse. A hearty Gun Fire breakfast was cooked by Don and his wife.

Three Springs service commenced with Warwick Trant singing songs for the occasion. The flypast of the Tiger Moth and the aerobatic plane was again a highlight. Students from Coorow, Carnamah and Three Springs schools shared readings and poems on the ANZAC theme. In his address, Bob Hunter reminded us of the sacrifices of our veterans and service personnel in all wars, conflicts and peace keeping duty. Bob gave us an insight into his career as a Squadron Commander of the SAS Black Hawk helicopter squadron that suffered a tragedy on a training exercise in Townsville, where 15 crew members were killed when 2 helicopters collided. The resilience,

trust and courage to rebuild that squadron has given Bob the skills to help build these traits in businesses, mining, and the corporate world. 80 people attended a soup and sandwich lunch in our community hall after a well -attended ANZAC service.

## Evictions – know your rights before you leave

Some Western Australians may be worrying about keeping a roof over their heads, as competition continues to remain high for rental properties right across the state.

Consumer Protection has been fielding enquiries from tenants who have received eviction notices because their landlord plans to sell the home in order to cash-in on rising property prices. Some tenants are also facing the prospect of unemployment, which is adding to the distress that an eviction may cause.

We want tenants to know that they cannot be forcibly evicted from a property straight after receiving an eviction notice, as there is a process involved in ending a tenancy. Landlords must give 30 days' notice to end a fixed-term tenancy and 60 days' notice to conclude a periodic lease.

If a tenant has received a notice of termination, but has not left the premises on the due date, the landlord must then apply to the court for an order for vacant possession of the property.

Any tenant who believes they may suffer hardship as a result of an eviction can ask the magistrate to suspend the termination order for up to 30 days. It is important to understand that if the magistrate grants the extension, the tenant must continue to pay rent for the duration.

Tenants being forced out illegally should know they have rights. If a landlord or property manager is making threats, being physically intimidating, changing the locks without their agreement or forcefully entering a property, tenants should in the first instance contact the police.

If a tenant doesn't have anywhere to go following eviction, the <u>Emergency Relief and Food Assistance Service (ERFRAS)</u> is a good first option – this service provided by Anglicare connects people with emergency relief assistance, financial counselling and other community help. If it's a crisis situation, we have an online <u>guide</u> to help tenants find a service that may be able to help.

## Make mum's day with our consumer advice

Mother's Day is on its way, so no matter whether you're looking for a gift online or in-store, remember that you have the same consumer rights if things go wrong.

The Australian Consumer Law protects you if the gift is faulty, breaks down, doesn't work as it should or is not what you ordered, and the trader should take steps to help fix the issue.

However, refunds aren't always an automatic right if you're not sure whether mum will like her gift. Businesses don't have to give you a refund if you buy the wrong size or colour, or simply change your mind. While some businesses still offer refunds in these situations to provide good customer service, it's not a legal requirement – so always check the store's returns policy before committing to buy.

If you're thinking of giving mum a gift card, it's important to understand the terms and conditions. Most gift cards and vouchers must come with a minimum three-year expiry period, with the expiry date to be clearly displayed. We also recommend using the gift card as soon as possible to avoid disappointment if the business changes hands or closes down.

Online shoppers should always research the retailer they are planning to do business with to avoid being scammed. Checking online reviews is important, but be aware that fake reviews can exist too. Also check the URL displays the correct domain name.

When making online payments, only pay for items using a secure payment service such as credit card or PayPal, and look for a URL starting with 'https' and a closed padlock symbol. Be suspicious if the only way to pay is via a non-secure payment method, such as direct bank transfer or cryptocurrency, because money sent this way is unlikely to be recovered if something goes wrong.

Once you've decided to proceed with a purchase, carefully read the terms and conditions and understand any cancellation or change fees before clicking 'pay now'. Check delivery timeframes as cut off times may apply for peak periods, and remember to screenshot or save any documentation, receipts or confirmation emails.

### **Country Stargazing**

with Carol Redford and Donna Vanzetti, Astrotourism WA

#### Meteor Showers & the Magical Milky Way

Stargazers will be treated to a special display when the Eta-Aquarids Meteor Shower passes by. This shower comes from Halley's Comet which orbits the sun once every 76 years and is not due to return to Earth until 2061. However, it still treats us to two meteor showers per year with the second shower being the Orionids on display in October.

The eta-Aquarids Meteor Shower is active from 19th April to 28th May with the peak happening on 6th May. With no Moon to wash out the views, it will be perfect conditions. It's predicted that there will be up to 50 meteors per hour at the peak of activity. It's worth seeing this meteor shower in the week or so either side as there can be up to 30 meteors per hour in the off-peak times.

When to look: Best seen before sunrise.

Which direction to look: On the eastern horizon, below Jupiter and Saturn.

Another awesome sight to see in our spectacular dark night skies, is the band of the Milky Way, stretching right across the sky. From mid autumn to mid spring, we look towards the centre or core of our own galaxy and see a cloudy band of billions of stars that arcs from the south east to the south west. Many people around the world are unable to witness this breathtaking view due to light pollution, however out in country WA, we can enjoy the experience of seeing the stunning Milky Way Galaxy in all its glory.


