



Stay safe and well this winter

Keeping warm and safe during the colder months of the year also means being alert to the hazards created by commonly used heating products within the home. Consumer protection authorities are urging Australians to stay safe this winter by knowing the risks associated with items like hot water bottles, wheat/heat packs, electric blankets and heaters.

June is also Burns Awareness Month, an initiative of Kidsafe Australia that focuses on raising awareness of prevention and correct first aid treatment for burns and scalds across all age groups.

According to the Burns Registry of Australia and New Zealand (BRANZ), about 76 percent of burn injuries happened in the home and around 18 children a week were admitted to hospital burns units, mostly due to scalds from hot drinks like tea and coffee.

BRANZ also found that nearly a quarter of children and 42 per cent of adults did not receive the recommended 'gold standard' first aid treatment for burns, which Kidsafe advises should include applying cool running water to the injury for 20 minutes. Hot water bottles are popular at this time of year, but they too come with a risk of burns. That's why it's important to only fill them with hot tap water, never boiling water, and avoid contact with the skin by using a fitted cover or wrap.

Wheat or heat packs are another way we might try to keep warm, but these can become a fire-hazard if not used correctly. Be sure to follow the heating instructions, and if you smell something burning, then allow it to cool and dispose of the pack. Electric blankets should always be turned off before falling asleep and remember to place heaters on a flat surface, away from children, pets and combustible items. Winter is also an important time of year to ensure your smoke alarm still works – if it's more than 10 years old, it's due for replacing, while the batteries should be replaced every 12 months.

Dear Shire of Three Springs residents,

Were you impacted by Cyclone Seroja and still need help?

I am writing to you as your residence, farm or business is within one of the 16 local government areas impacted by Cyclone Seroja. There are different types of help available for people affected by the cyclone. I encourage you to speak with a Community Recovery Officer about your situation to find out what type of help is available.

Local face-to-face and telephone help Residents in the Shire of Three Springs can contact Community Recovery Officer Deborah on 0459 966 311 for a chat.

You can also meet a Community Recovery Officer face-to-face at one of the recovery hubs located in Geraldton, Kalbarri, Northampton, Morawa, Mingenew or pop-up hubs in Yuna, Nabawa, Perenjori and Mullewa.

If you are experiencing personal hardship or distress because of the cyclone, please phone the Department of Communities Disaster Response Hotline on 1800 032 965 for immediate support.

Help for uninsured house damage

There is help to clean-up damaged homes that were not insured. If you or someone you know is living with cyclone rubbish that makes the house unsafe call 1800 490 678 to find out about the help available.

Help for insured house damage

Financial help is available if your insurance claim does not cover all your repair costs. If you find yourself out of pocket due to the cost of repairing your property back to its pre-cyclone state please call 1800 490 678 for more information.

If you want to make your house stronger against future cyclones there is financial help to cover costs for installing specific upgrades in your home. To find out more go to dfes.wa.gov.au/recoveryandresiliencegrants or call 1800 490 678.

Help for small business owners

If your small business was impacted by the cyclone and you need help with the cost of clean-up and repairs there is financial assistance available. To find out more go to smallbusiness.wa.gov.au/ seroja or call 133 140.

Help for primary producers

If you are a primary producer impacted by the cyclone there is financial assistance available. To find out what the assistance covers and how to apply go to agric.wa.gov.au/emergency-response/disaster-recovery-funding-arrangements.

Help for owners of heritage and cultural sites. There is financial help to recover the costs of repairing heritage buildings and cultural sites. The owners can be private organisations, individuals or local governments. If you have already completed repairs you may still claim eligible costs. To find out more call 6551 9993.

Help coping with your situation

Living through a natural disaster can affect how you think, feel and act. If you are not coping as well as you normally would, your local recovery staff from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Department of Communities and Red Cross are available for a confidential chat. They can help you get the support you need, as well as take the stress out of applying for financial assistance by helping you through the application process.

PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT WEST ERREGULLA PROCESSING PLANT AND PIPELINE EPBC 2021/8907

INFORMATION ONLY

The following notice is published pursuant to Section 95A(3) of the *Environment Protection* and *Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999 (EPBC Act).

AGI Operations Pty Limited (AGIO) proposes to construct and operate the West Erregulla Processing Plant and Pipeline, Western Australia. The project is located approximately 30 kilometres (km) south-east of Dongara, WA.

The project includes the processing of gas from upstream wells (outside of the project scope) and the transport of the gas to the Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline (DBNGP). The Proposed Action includes:

- A gas processing facility, with a nominal design flow capacity of 87 terajoules per day (TJ/d);
- A 16.5 km interconnecting buried gas pipeline between the facility and the DBNGP tie-in point;
- Supporting infrastructure proposed to include but not limited to accommodation, power generation, flare system, water treatment package, back-up diesel system and communications; and
- Vegetation clearing of up to 90 ha of land to support the above infrastructure.

The proposed action has been determined to be a 'controlled action' under the EPBC Act (EPBC 2021/8907). The controlling provision under the EPBC Act is 'listed threatened species and communities' (sections 18 and 18A).

The Commonwealth Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment has advised that the proposed action is being assessed through preliminary documentation. The preliminary documentation for the proposed action is on display and will be publically available from the 27 June 2022 at the following locations and will be available for two weeks (until 11 July 2022) for comments:

Country Stargazing

Super Moons and Meteor Showers - July Has It All!

Stargazers have plenty to see this month, starting with a "Supermoon" on 13th July. The Moon's orbit around Earth is slightly oval shaped or elliptical. So, every month there's a time when the Moon is at its closest distance to Earth (at perigee) and another time when it is at its furthest distance from Earth (at apogee).

When perigee coincides with the full Moon, it's popularly called a "Supermoon".

And when the Moon is at apogee? Well, it's a "Micromoon"!

When to look: The Moon rises at 4.50pm on 13th July. It will be at perigee and approx. 357,122 kms from Earth.

Which direction to look: You will need a low, clear horizon as the Moon rises in the east:

Does a Supermoon look bigger to the naked eye? Find out at https://astrotourismwa.com.au/supermoon/

At months end we will be treated to the Southern Delta-Aquarids Meteor Shower. Meteor showers occur as planet Earth crosses the orbital path of a comet. As comets pass by the sun, the extreme temperatures heat up the nucleus causing debris particles to spread out creating a comet tail. As Earth passes through this debris cloud, we see the fiery spectacle of a meteor shower.

The peak of the shower coincides with a new moon, meaning conditions are ideal to spot these sizzling 'shooting stars'.

When to look: Peak is on 29th July, but worth looking either side of this date too. Best after midnight in the early morning with meteors appearing to emanate from a point high in the north- eastern sky.

Enjoy a bumper month of cosmic views.



B Grade -


