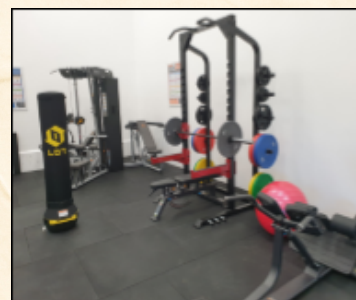
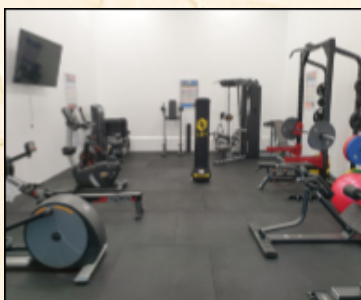
The Three Springs Gym Is Open

Don't let a stressed ceiling go over your head

A sudden ceiling collapse can turn a comfortable home into a disaster zone in an instant, with the potential for serious injury and significant damage to property and possessions.

Consumer Protection recently became aware of two tenants who had been given seven days to vacate their rental property following the collapse of their living room ceiling.

As we step in to help the parties reach an agreement, we want to remind tenants, landlords and property managers that seven-day termination notices are unlawful unless the home has been destroyed or deemed uninhabitable by a local government authority.

There are often warning signs a ceiling is about to give way, so it is important for tenants to alert their landlords and agents about any loud cracking sounds, sagging or dropping of the plasterboard sheeting and/or cornice, or any visual cracking. Small circles or blisters (nail pops) in a line on the ceiling can indicate the plasterboard sheeting is pulling away from the nails or screws. Landlords need to respond to such reports and ensure necessary repairs are undertaken to prevent a collapse.

If a ceiling does collapse, landlords are legally responsible for bringing the property back to a liveable condition and must initiate these urgent repairs within 48 hours.

Should the landlord or agent fail to respond to a written request for repairs within a reasonable timeframe, a tenant may serve a breach notice. If the issue continues to be ignored, an application can be made to the Magistrates Court for an order that the necessary repairs be undertaken.

While it is important to keep paying rent until the matter is resolved, a tenant is entitled to ask the court for a rent reduction if the issue means part of the property – such as a second bathroom – is unable to be used.

We always recommend tenants arrange their own contents insurance in case they need to replace damaged possessions. However, if the damage is caused by a fault in the building, such as a lack of maintenance, then a tenant may decide to seek compensation from the landlord through the courts.

If a tenant believes their landlord or agent has failed to initiate repairs in a reasonable timeframe, or has issued an unlawful termination notice, they should contact Consumer Protection on consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or 1300 30 40 54.

The waiting game – your rights when parcels fail to arrive

Online shopping has revolutionised the way many of us buy goods, but it has also meant navigating additional challenges not faced by traditional in-store shoppers.

Given online purchasers are required to pay for their items upfront before waiting to receive them, a common complaint we hear about is goods taking a long time to arrive, or perhaps never arriving at all.

We recently raised the alarm about national online retailer, Kingdom Warehouse, after 22 WA consumers had been left waiting up to 450 days for their items to arrive. Our counterparts in Victoria, where the retailer is located, issued an earlier warning after receiving 284 similar complaints.

As we urge consumers to avoid ordering from Kingdom Warehouse while investigations continue, it's a timely reminder for consumers to do their homework when shopping online.

Do some internet research before using an online retailer to see what reviews/blog posts come up when you type in the name of the site into your search engine.

Better yet, try to use reputable, well-known retail websites. For smaller or lesser known online sellers, look for a phone number and physical address and call them if you feel unsure.

When placing an order, confirm the timeframe for delivery or if possible a set date. Keep a record of your transaction by printing or taking a screenshot of your order confirmation, invoice or receipt. Be sure to check the seller's policy on returns, refunds, shipping, insurance, warranties etc. especially if they are based overseas.

Use a secure payment system, like credit card or PayPal, as they offer a dispute resolution service with a refund option if your goods don't arrive.

Should the goods fail to arrive in a reasonable amount of time, your Australian Consumer Law (ACL) rights mean you can ask for a refund or other remedy such as a credit note. If you have paid by credit card and do not receive your purchase, you should seek a chargeback from your financial institution.

WA customers of Kingdom Warehouse who have not received their goods after a reasonable time are urged to lodge a complaint on the Consumer Protection website if they haven't already.

Safe sleep for babies

Babies can spend up to 17 hours a day sleeping, so it's vital to ensure the place where they spend all this time resting is as safe as possible.

As the range of infant sleeping products available in the Australian market continues to grow, leading medical and injury prevention experts, industry and regulators have developed a new best practice guide for the design of safe infant sleeping environments.

Developed to help industry, the guide highlights essential considerations for designing, marketing and supplying safe infant sleep products, and includes a checklist that can be used to identify product use and hazards.

As we help share the messaging from this important guide with industry, it's timely to remind parents and carers of infants to ensure their own practices at home are safe.

Red Nose, the charity organisation that aims to eradicate sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), recommends babies sleep on their back on a firm and flat surface in a safety-compliant cot that doesn't contain blankets, toys, pillows or bumpers.

It is important to keep cots away from hanging cords, such as those on blinds, curtains or electrical appliances, as they could get caught around a baby's neck.

Although infants may fall asleep for long periods in car seats, swings or bouncers, they should always be monitored to ensure their heads haven't fallen forwards, as this may push the chin down towards the chest, leading to the airway becoming blocked.

If using a baby sling, it's important to learn how to use it safely to prevent suffocation – the baby's face should be visible at all times, not snuggled against fabric or the wearer's body.

Other sleep hazards for infants can include being left unattended on an adult bed, bunk bed; being placed on a beanbag, couch, pillow or cushion; being left with a sleeping adult or child on a bed, couch or chair; and second-hand smoke.

Super Moons and Meteor Showers – July Has It All!

Stargazers have plenty to see this month, starting with a “Supermoon” on 13th July. The Moon’s orbit around Earth is slightly oval shaped or elliptical. So, every month there’s a time when the Moon is at its closest distance to Earth (at perigee) and another time when it is at its furthest distance from Earth (at apogee).

When perigee coincides with the full Moon, it’s popularly called a “Supermoon”. And when the Moon is at apogee? Well, it’s a “Micromoon”!

When to look: The Moon rises at 4.50pm on 13th July. It will be at perigee and approx. 357,122 kms from Earth.

Which direction to look: You will need a low, clear horizon as the Moon rises in the east.

At months end we will be treated to the Southern Delta-Aquarids Meteor Shower. Meteor showers occur as planet Earth crosses the orbital path of a comet. As comets pass by the sun, the extreme temperatures heat up the nucleus causing debris particles to spread out creating a comet tail. As Earth passes through this debris cloud, we see the fiery spectacle of a meteor shower.

The peak of the shower coincides with a new moon, meaning conditions are ideal to spot these sizzling ‘shooting stars’.

When to look: Peak is on 29th July, but worth looking either side of this date too. Best after midnight in the early morning with meteors appearing to emanate from a point high in the north-eastern sky.

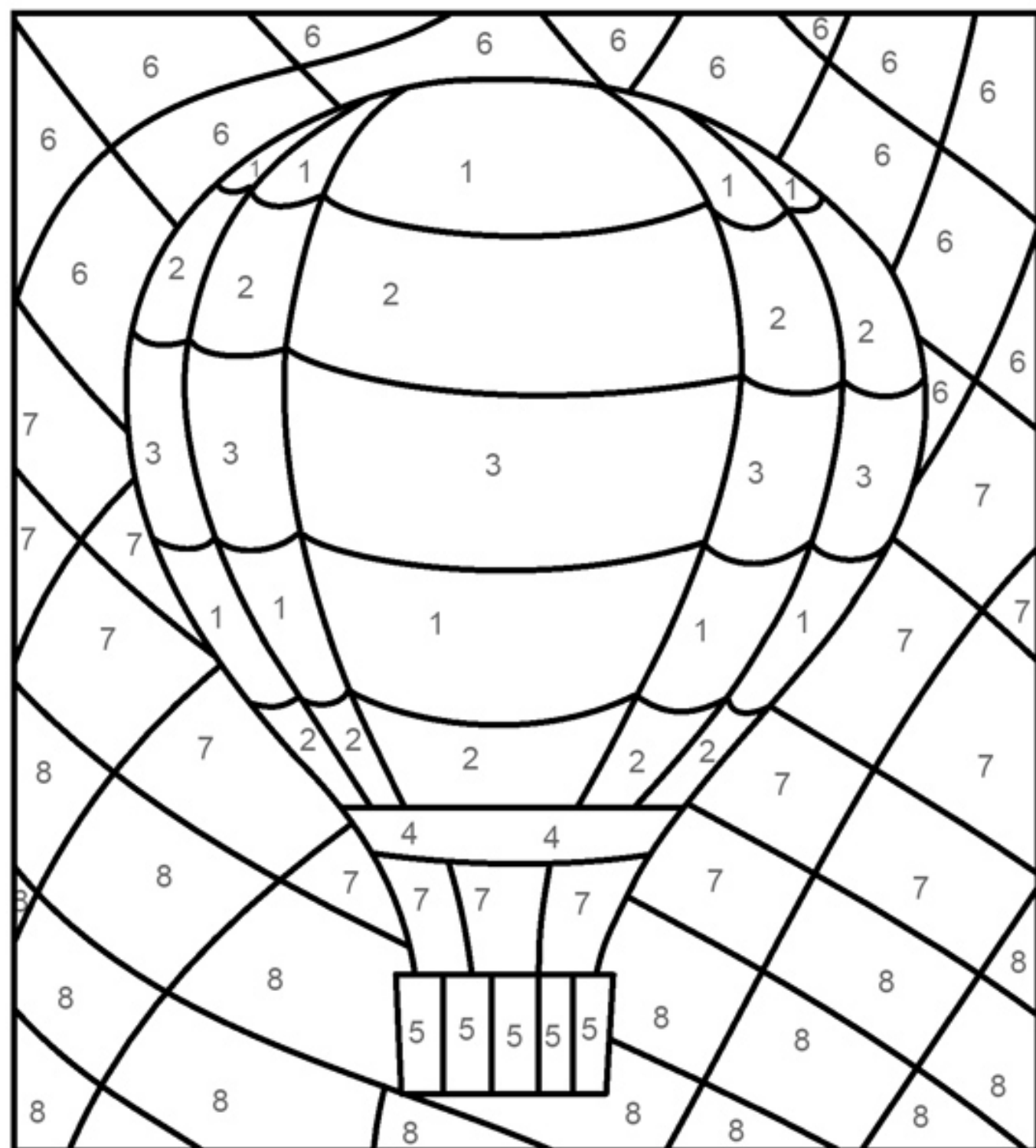

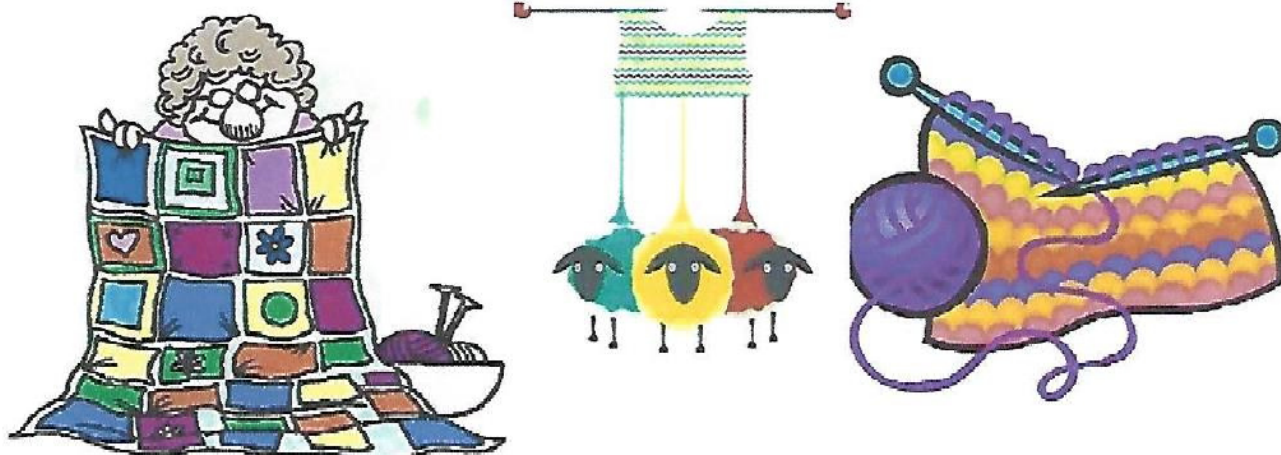

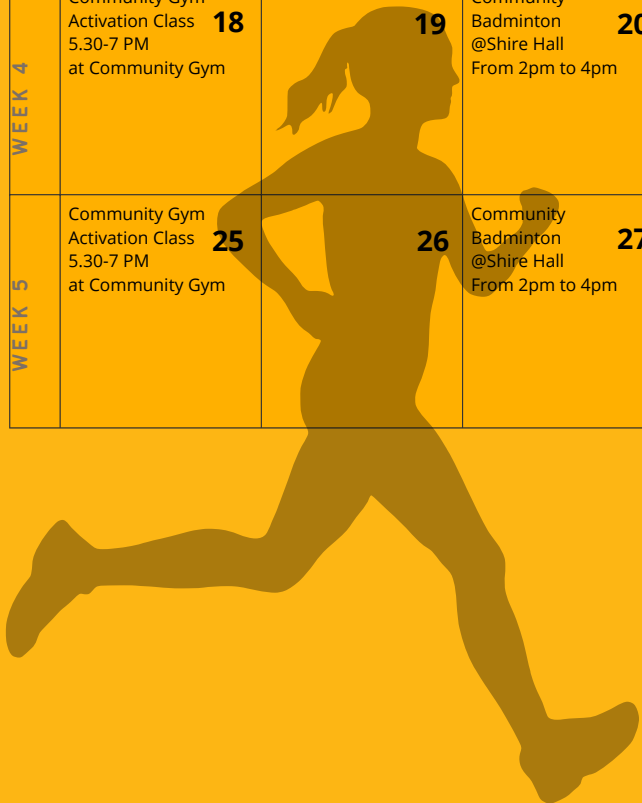
