Watch out for rogue removalists

Moving house is widely considered to be one of life's most stressful events, so we always urge consumers to choose their removalist carefully to avoid any extra drama on the day.

Consumer Protection has recently received a growing number of complaints about the conduct of removalists advertising on social media. Initially the trader quotes an hourly rate and requests a small deposit, however upon arrival they demand a large lump sum be paid up front with a promise to return any unused money once the job is complete.

In some cases, the traders have refused to return or deliver the furniture until the higher fees have been paid. Neither are the promised refunds forthcoming and belongings are often damaged during the move for which a remedy is never provided.

Damage to property accounted for just over half of the 262 complaints we received about removalists in the past 18 months. Disagreements over costs was another top issue, along with removal trucks turning up late.

Consumers are urged to be wary when sourcing removalists on social media, as they may be using someone else's ABN to appear legitimate. It can also be tricky to identify the individual behind a business that is only advertised on social media, meaning consumers may struggle to enforce their rights should they wish to pursue legal action.

When sourcing a removalist, we recommend giving preference to removalists that are members of the Australian Furniture Removals Association or get recommendations from family and friends.

It is best to make sure all the details are worked out and agreed to before the move. Consumers should get a proposal on company letterhead that contains a copy of the terms and conditions and clearly sets out an hourly rate or a fixed price for the job.

Like other traders, removalists must exercise due care and skill by doing all they can to prevent damage or loss, and the consumer has the right to claim compensation if they fail to do this. Consumers who are having issues with a removalist that cannot be resolved can lodge an online complaint on the Consumer Protection website or email consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au.

How rising rent may impact your bond

As rents continue rising across Western Australia, many tenants are finding that in addition to paying more money to live in their home each week, there is an extra expense they need to consider.

After rent is increased at a property, a landlord or property manager is entitled to ask the tenant to pay extra money towards their security bond.

Known as a 'bond top-up', the amount of money requested will depend on how much the weekly rent has increased by. For a property rented at \$1,200 a week or less, the maximum total security bond that can be charged is the equivalent of four weeks' rent, while for weekly rents above \$1,200 there is no limit on the total bond that can be charged. New figures show the Bonds Administration team at Consumer Protection has handled around 69,000 bond top-ups since the COVID-19 rental moratorium ended 15 months ago – an average of 153 lodgements a day. This figure is around three times higher than the 50 lodgements the team typically processed before the emergency period took effect.

Tenants facing rent rises should know there are strict rules surrounding how often their landlords or property managers are allowed to request the extra funds be paid. In both fixed-term and periodic (no fixed end-date) leases, rent increases can only occur after the first six months, and on a half-yearly basis thereafter.

Only once the rent has been lawfully increased can the landlord or property manager request a bond top-up and they must provide the tenant with a receipt detailing the date the money was received, the name of the person (or people) paying the bond, the amount paid and the address of the rental property.

The tenant should also expect to receive a notification from the Bonds Administrator that the bond variation has been received.

While market forces generally determine rental prices, if a tenant believes what they're paying is too high, they should try negotiating with the landlord or property manager to request a reduction or argue against a proposed increase, before making an application to the Magistrates Court.





Country Stargazing

with Carol Redford and Donna Vanzetti, Astrotourism WA Super Moons and Meteor Showers – July Has It All!

Spectacular Night Skies

We are smack bang in the middle of "Milky Way Season"! That's because, during this time of year, we look towards the centre or core of our Milky Way Galaxy. It's dense with stars and stretches across the dark night sky in country WA. Astrophotographers love it!

The Milky Way is best seen when there's no moonlight and you're away from bright city lights. What you're looking for is a band of cloudy or dusty looking light that stretches in an arc from the south east to the south west. It looks like a cloud, but it's actually billions of stars that make up the Milky Way Galaxy, our home in the Universe. Throughout August and September, the core or heart of the Milky Way is high in the southern sky.

Saturn returns to our evening skies and on the 12th will be right by the Moon with both shining brilliantly.

And to add to this cosmic spectacular, we have another meteor shower to enjoy. The Perseids meteor shower is generated from comet Swift-Tutle and renowned for producing bright meteors. The shower peaks on the night of the 12th/13th of August but can be viewed several days either side of the peak. The best views will be under dark skies, after midnight. The further north you are in WA, the better you will see this meteor shower.

To See Saturn & the Moon: All night on the 12th, from the early evening, looking towards the eastern horizon.

Enjoy a bumper month of cosmic views.

Dear Shire of Three Springs residents,

Were you impacted by Cyclone Seroja and still need help?

I am writing to you as your residence, farm or business is within one of the 16 local government areas impacted by Cyclone Seroja. There are different types of help available for people affected by the cyclone. I encourage you to speak with a Community Recovery Officer about your situation to find out what type of help is available.

Local face-to-face and telephone help Residents in the Shire of Three Springs can contact Community Recovery Officer Deborah on 0459 966 311 for a chat.

You can also meet a Community Recovery Officer face-to-face at one of the recovery hubs located in Geraldton, Kalbarri, Northampton, Morawa, Mingenew or pop-up hubs in Yuna, Nabawa, Perenjori and Mullewa.

If you are experiencing personal hardship or distress because of the cyclone, please phone the Department of Communities Disaster Response Hotline on 1800 032 965 for immediate support.

Help for uninsured house damage

There is help to clean-up damaged homes that were not insured. If you or someone you know is living with cyclone rubbish that makes the house unsafe call 1800 490 678 to find out about the help available.

Help for insured house damage

Financial help is available if your insurance claim does not cover all your repair costs. If you find yourself out of pocket due to the cost of repairing your property back to its pre-cyclone state please call 1800 490 678 for more information.

If you want to make your house stronger against future cyclones there is financial help to cover costs for installing specific upgrades in your home. To find out more go to dfes.wa.gov.au/recoveryandresiliencegrants or call 1800 490 678.

Help for small business owners

If your small business was impacted by the cyclone and you need help with the cost of clean-up and repairs there is financial assistance available. To find out more go to smallbusiness.wa.gov.au/ seroja or call 133 140.

Help for primary producers

If you are a primary producer impacted by the cyclone there is financial assistance available. To find out what the assistance covers and how to apply go to agric.wa.gov.au/emergency-response/disaster-recovery-funding-arrangements.

Help for owners of heritage and cultural sites. There is financial help to recover the costs of repairing heritage buildings and cultural sites. The owners can be private organisations, individuals or local governments. If you have already completed repairs you may still claim eligible costs. To find out more call 6551 9993.

Help coping with your situation

Living through a natural disaster can affect how you think, feel and act. If you are not coping as well as you normally would, your local recovery staff from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Department of Communities and Red Cross are available for a confidential chat. They can help you get the support you need, as well as take the stress out of applying for financial assistance by helping you through the application process.

Where to find more information

You can find more detailed information about the types of help and the location of the recovery hubs on the Cyclone Seroja State Recovery webpage at emergency.wa.gov.au/recovery.


