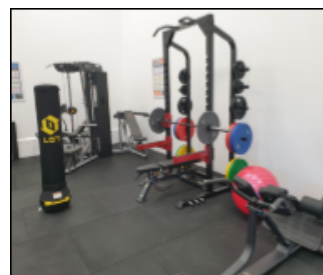
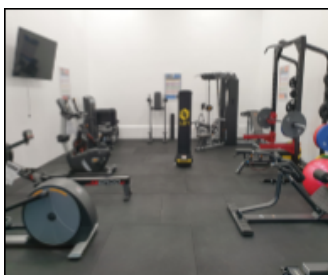
The Three Springs Gym Is Open

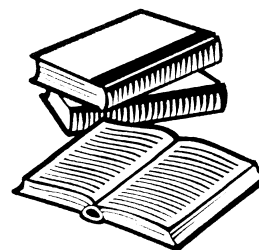

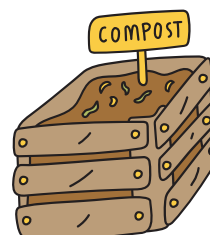
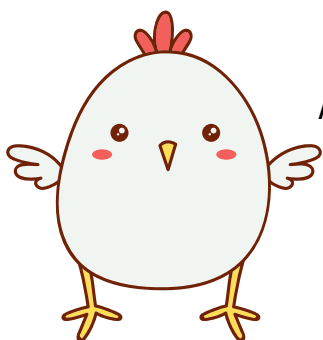

Sister Mary Ryan and the Dominican Sisters thanked the Shire for presenting the panel.

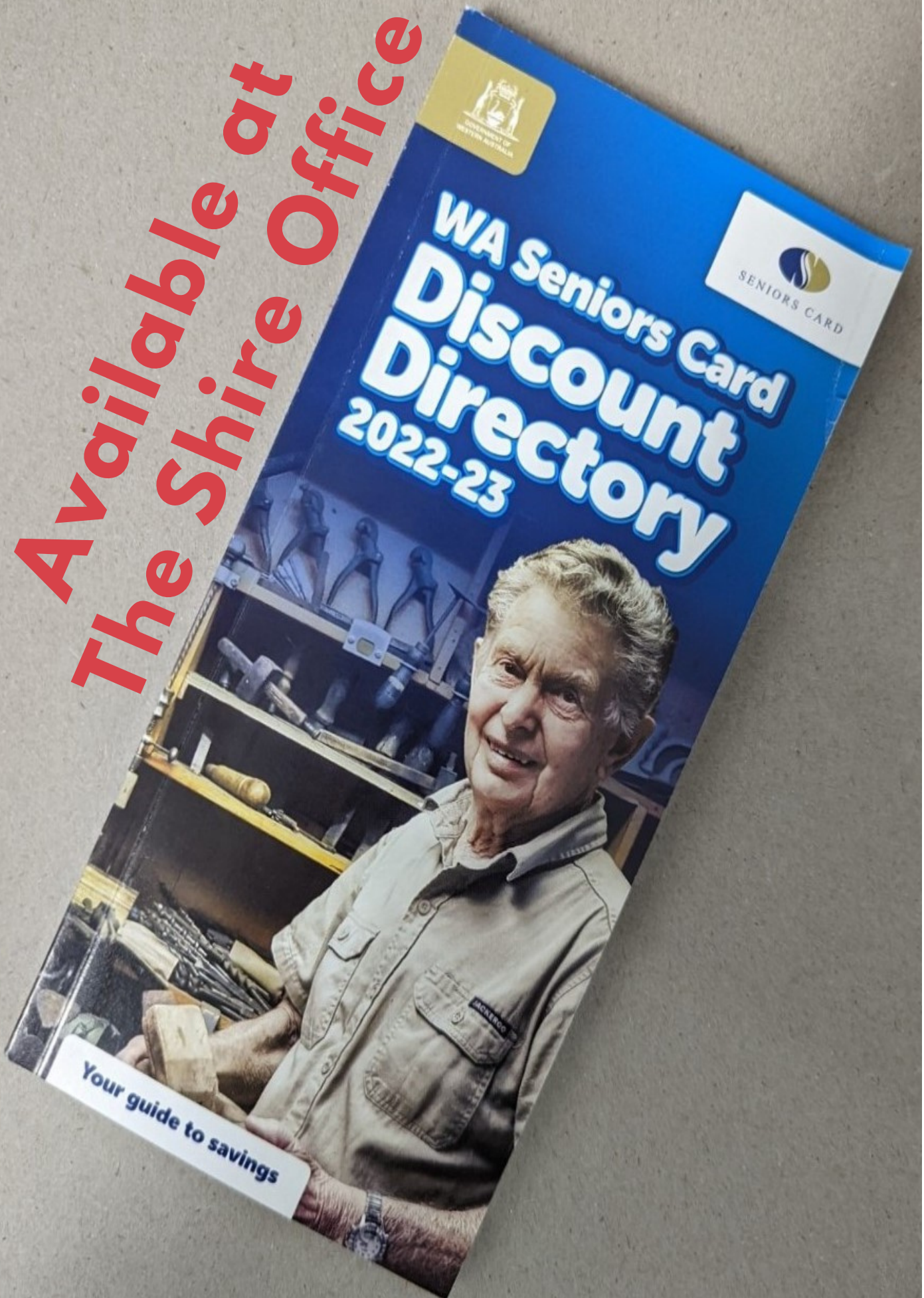

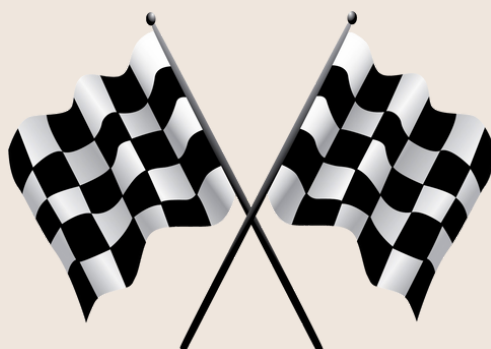

Mould in rental properties: consumer complaints rise

Mould or dampness around a home can pose a health risk and should be removed as soon as it's noticed, yet complaints about mould in rental properties have risen.

Mould is a fungal growth that thrives on moisture. It can exacerbate health problems like asthma, respiratory infections and rashes, cause unpleasant smells, damage to buildings or contents and lead to expensive repairs. The number of people who contacted Consumer Protection about mould in rental properties jumped this financial year, with complaints up 21.2 per cent. Enquiries were also up 9.1 per cent. In total, we received 383 enquiries and 40 complaints.

Preventing damage from mould requires a joint effort, and both tenants and lessors have responsibilities. Moisture should be restricted from entering a property (from roof leaks and floods for instance) and also from being generated indoors (from pipes or spills within the home). Ensuring adequate ventilation is also important. A landlord could be in breach of a rental agreement if mould develops due to a lack of maintenance or repairs, for instance a broken exhaust fan or window (meaning a room can't be ventilated), damp walls caused by plumbing issues, or a leaky roof, broken pipe or flood damage.

A tenant could be in breach if mould develops because they don't aerate a bathroom using an exhaust fan or by opening a window, if they dry clothes indoors and don't air the room afterwards, get carpet wet and fail to dry it out properly, or leave water pooling on tiles.

Where a tenant believes a landlord or agent hasn't reasonably responded to a request to fix mould-related problems, they can issue a breach notice to the landlord and apply to the Magistrates Court for a court order for repairs or compensation, such as a reduction in rent until the repairs occur.

Tenants can also contact their Local Government and request an Environmental Health Officer assessment.

Celebrating 50 years of protecting consumers

With Consumer Protection recently celebrating its 50th anniversary in Western Australia, we have been reminded that while many things have changed over the last five decades, there is also so much that has remained the same. Back in the early 1970s, second-hand cars accounted for 40 per cent of the complaints we handled, while travel agents, tenancy and product safety were the other big issues affecting WA consumers.

Now, 50 years later, we have handled 250,000 consumer and tenancy complaints and achieved \$69 million in redress for those impacted. Many of the same issues are still relevant today and so too is the way we handle them. Community education, complaints management, public namings and prosecutions remain a consistent way we alert consumers to issues while simultaneously holding to account those who do the wrong thing.

Even though much remains unchanged, the last 50 years have yielded incredible advancements in the way business is conducted.

The speed of electronic communications may have made it easier to do business, but it has also created new opportunities for scammers and dodgy traders seeking to take advantage. Scams and other forms of misleading and deceiving conduct are rapidly evolving issues that will require sophisticated and innovative ways to combat them.

Just as the business landscape changed, so too did the laws that governed it. Up until 11 years ago, there were 17 different national, state and territory laws covering consumer issues in Australia, before they were all replaced on 1 January 2011 with the Australian Consumer Law (ACL). In what remains the most significant change to consumer laws to date, the ACL means that no matter where they are in this country, consumers could know their rights and traders understood their obligations.

Heralding a new era of consumer protection in Australia, the ACL was backed up with greater penalties and enforcement powers than had existed previously. This afforded State and Federal agencies a wider scope to take action for breaches of consumer laws, provide more compensation options for unlawful conduct, and introduce product safety standards.

Country Stargazing

The Big Three! Saturn, Jupiter & the Moon!

This month, stargazers are in for a treat as the two gas giants, Saturn and Jupiter, take to the skies and are joined by the Moon, to make for a stargazing spectacle! All three are bright and brilliant in the night sky and worth noting in the diary for a 'sneaky stargazing binge!

On the 8th, Saturn is making a close approach to the Moon! If you've never seen Saturn before, now is the PERFECT time to find the ringed giant, just look for the bright star next to the Moon! The following night, the Moon will be underneath Saturn.

To see Saturn & the Moon: 8th September from 6pm, looking to the eastern horizon.

On the 11th, brilliant Jupiter will be just below the full Moon so easy to spot, and on the 26th, Jupiter will reach opposition, becoming it's biggest and brightest all year.

To see Jupiter & the Moon: The conjunction when Jupiter and the Moon appear close together is on the 11th and opposition is on the 26th, in the east at sunset, through to west at sunrise.

What is Opposition? In astronomy, opposition means a planet is opposite the sun. So, for example, the planets with orbits inside Earth's orbit (Mercury and Venus) can't be at opposition. But the planets orbiting outside Earth's orbit, can. At opposition, a planet is easiest to observe because it's generally closest to Earth and visible throughout the night.

Dear Shire of Three Springs residents,

Were you impacted by Cyclone Seroja and still need help?

I am writing to you as your residence, farm or business is within one of the 16 local government areas impacted by Cyclone Seroja. There are different types of help available for people affected by the cyclone. I encourage you to speak with a Community Recovery Officer about your situation to find out what type of help is available.

Local face-to-face and telephone help

Residents in the Shire of Three Springs can contact Community Recovery Officer Deborah on 0459 966 311 for a chat.

You can also meet a Community Recovery Officer face-to-face at one of the recovery hubs located in Geraldton, Kalbarri, Northampton, Morawa, Mingenew or pop-up hubs in Yuna, Nabawa, Perenjori and Mullewa.

If you are experiencing personal hardship or distress because of the cyclone, please phone the Department of Communities Disaster Response Hotline on 1800 032 965 for immediate support.

Help for uninsured house damage

There is help to clean-up damaged homes that were not insured. If you or someone you know is living with cyclone rubbish that makes the house unsafe call 1800 490 678 to find out about the help available.

Help for insured house damage

Financial help is available if your insurance claim does not cover all your repair costs. If you find yourself out of pocket due to the cost of repairing your property back to its pre-cyclone state please call 1800 490 678 for more information.

If you want to make your house stronger against future cyclones there is financial help to cover costs for installing specific upgrades in your home. To find out more go to dfes.wa.gov.au/recoveryandresiliencegrants or call 1800 490 678.

Help for small business owners

If your small business was impacted by the cyclone and you need help with the cost of clean-up and repairs there is financial assistance available. To find out more go to smallbusiness.wa.gov.au/seroja or call 133 140.

Help for primary producers

If you are a primary producer impacted by the cyclone there is financial assistance available. To find out what the assistance covers and how to apply go to agric.wa.gov.au/emergency-response/disaster-recovery-funding-arrangements.

Help for owners of heritage and cultural sites

There is financial help to recover the costs of repairing heritage buildings and cultural sites. The owners can be private organisations, individuals or local governments. If you have already completed repairs you may still claim eligible costs. To find out more call 6551 9993.

Help coping with your situation

Living through a natural disaster can affect how you think, feel and act. If you are not coping as well as you normally would, your local recovery staff from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Department of Communities and Red Cross are available for a confidential chat. They can help you get the support you need, as well as take the stress out of applying for financial assistance by helping you through the application process.

Where to find more information

You can find more detailed information about the types of help and the location of the recovery hubs on the Cyclone Seroja State Recovery webpage at emergency.wa.gov.au/recovery.

Recovering from a natural disaster can be a challenging, slow and frustrating process. I would like to reassure you that you are not alone. Recovery staff can explain what help is available. Please contact them and find out how they can help your recovery.
