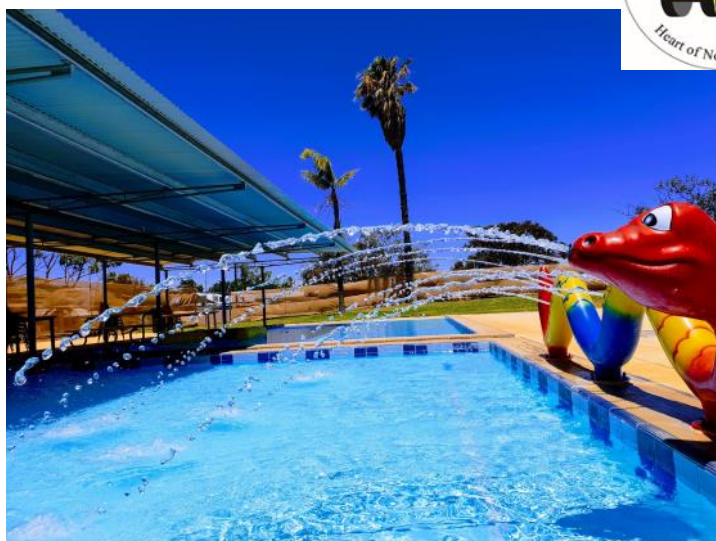

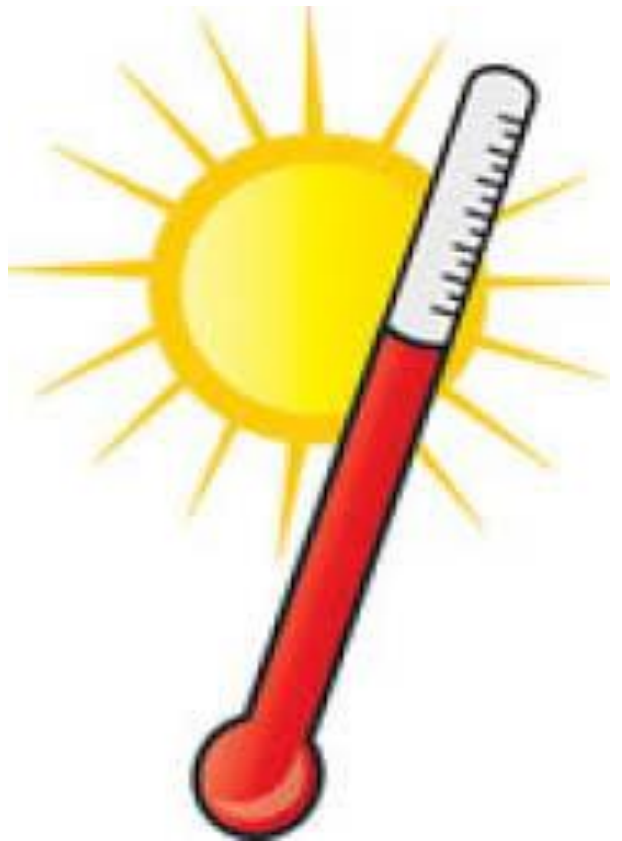
Church Notices

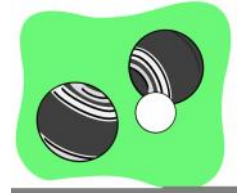

Police News

Harvest is well and truly under way in town, so as always we advise to be a little bit more cautious on the roads as there are a lot more road trains and heavy machinery moving about at this time of year.

Three Springs Magistrates Court also returned on Wednesday the 18th November, with some of the results as follows:

- A 25 year old male from Three Springs was convicted of possessing drug paraphernalia. He received a \$100 fine and was ordered to pay \$248.70 in court costs.
- A 41 year old female from Carnamah was convicted for possessing drug paraphernalia and a prohibited drug, for which she received a community based order and ordered to pay \$248.70 in court costs.
- A 38 year old female was convicted for possessing a prohibited drug and drug paraphernalia. She was fined a total of \$500 in fines and ordered to pay \$248.70 in court costs.
- A 51 year old male from Morawa was convicted for Excess 0.08, his licence was suspended for 7 months, a \$550 fine and ordered to pay \$248.70 in court costs.
- A 50 year old male from Muluckine was charge with possessing a prohibited drug. He was fined \$300 and ordered to pay \$248.70 in court costs.
- A 17 year old male from Yandanooka was convicted of reckless driving after he was stopped previously driving at a speed of over 155km an hour. As a result of this he was fined \$800 and has had his licence suspended for six months, after which he will have to reapply for a new licence.

You may also remember we charged a local male with reckless driving after he was found to have done several burn outs on Williamson Street in Three Springs earlier this month. We are pleased that the male was deeply apologetic for his actions and plead guilty in court at the earliest opportunity, and as a result he has lost his driving licence for six months and was fined \$1000 and ordered to pay \$248.70 in court costs.

While we are on the subject of driving, sadly we are still receiving reports of people riding dirt bikes on premises they are not allowed. We will say this again, if we catch anyone riding an off-road bike where they are not supposed to be, they face getting charged with trespass and will have a day in court, further to that, the dirt bike may also likely be seized and destroyed. Please **do not** ride anywhere you do not have express permission to, and do not ride on the road to get to any other place if your bike is not registered and road worthy.

Ending on more positive news, and we have just celebrated an excellent NAIDOC week, culminating in a great community event that all the officers worked on with the Shire, and the local primary school. It was a superb event that was appreciated by all. Part of the day saw local school children doing some absolutely fantastic paintings, some of which we will proudly be displaying inside the police station from next week.

I believe we will also have a special guest from next week, as Betsy the Three Springs Primary School cow will Moo've from her current location at the Shire grounds. You may notice her udderly beautiful paint job as you drive past-ure local station from Monday on. I will stop with the puns now as I feel I have milked this enough.

Round 2 of the Regional Airports Program Opens

9 November 2020

Round 2 of the Regional Airports Program is part of the Australian Government's commitment to enhancing the accessibility and safety of regional airports and aerodromes across Australia.

A Morrison Government program to ensure regional communities remain safely connected to people, goods and new opportunities via the skies is open for another round of applications.

The Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price believes this is a particularly important funding opportunity for the many small and regional air facilities across Durack.

"We have responded to feedback to change the guidelines so that small local government and Indigenous corporations with projects of \$300,000 or less can now seek funding for 100 per cent of eligible project costs. This will help to deliver essential works at a time it is needed most while supporting local employment opportunities," Ms Price said.

"Regional airports provide a vital link for regional communities, ensuring the delivery of essential goods and services such as mail, food supplies, health care and passenger air services," Ms Price said.

The Morrison Government has committed \$100 million over four years from 2019-2020 to 2022-23 to ensure the owners and operators of regional airports can deliver improved safety and capability, including upgraded runways, taxiways, as well as new fencing, navigational aids and lighting."

Applications for Round 2 will remain open until 15 December 2020, providing communities the time needed to develop strong proposals.

Solar future is bright, but do your research

Our sunny skies have paved the way for a booming solar panel industry in Western Australia, as many households look for ways to cut their power bills while also reducing their carbon footprint.

Rooftop solar has become so popular in fact, it's estimated that 300,000 WA households already have panels installed, accounting for one-fifth of the electricity produced in our main network.

Even though there's a lot to love about this renewable, some consumers have come to Consumer Protection with complaints about poor quality parts, companies going broke and pushy sales tactics.

If you're considering installing rooftop solar, firstly ask yourself whether they are suitable for your needs, as solar often benefits consumers who use most of their electricity during the day. Also work out how much you will save by checking your energy usage on a recent bill.

Should you decide that the savings are worth it, it's also important to consider the orientation and pitch of your roof to determine how much sun your panels would receive, as well as being across the total price of having all the components (panels and inverter) of a system installed.

Before agreeing to buy a solar PV system:

- Get several quotes for the total cost;
- Make sure your preferred supplier is accredited by searching the [Clean Energy Council](#) (CEC) website;
- If a supplier's verbal claims are influencing your decision, have them included in the contract;
- Understand the contract's terms and conditions;
- Check with your insurer as your home insurance may need to be extended to cover the system;
- If you live in a strata scheme, check that you have approval to install a system; and
- Read online reviews and feedback about the retailer

Solar power providers are not allowed to use forceful or high pressured sales tactics to get you to buy something, nor can they provide you with false or misleading information. They must also ensure their products and services meet the consumer guarantees. Stay safe this summer

As the weather warms up, our thoughts are likely turning to summer holidays and the festive season, however it's important that consumers research their purchases to make sure they are safe and fit for purpose.

Faulty products continue to cause serious injury and harm to thousands of Australians every year – in 2017-18, more than 4.5 million faulty or unsafe items were recalled by suppliers.

To protect your home against fire risks at Christmas, choose less hazardous options for decorations, use low-voltage lights and keep flammable items away from the tree.

Consumers should also check to see all decorations meet Australian Standards, cords are not frayed or exposed, and power sockets are not overloaded. While Christmas shopping, families should be on the lookout for button batteries or small magnets in children's toys, as both are dangerous and potentially deadly when swallowed. If you have any doubts about a product, it's always a good idea to check whether there has been a product recall.

Aside from festivities, there are a number of risks around the yard, pools and water that can quickly turn dangerous if used without proper supervision. Hundreds of Australian children attend hospitals across the country for trampoline-related injuries including cuts, sprains and fractures. Before use, adults should check the condition of the trampoline and padding and ensure the surrounds are clear of hazards.

Pool users should only use aquatic toys and flotation devices under supervision, as children who cannot swim may drown if the toy fails, or isn't used properly. Children injured while playing with a toy in the water are also at greater risk of drowning. Swimming pools are the leading location for drowning in children under the age of 15, so it is important to make sure that your pool gates and locks are in working order.

And check your lifejackets are up to date with your local marine safety agency requirements and wear them when out on your watercraft - every year lives are lost and many deaths could have been prevented by wearing a lifejacket.

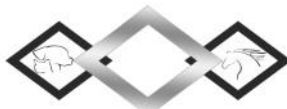

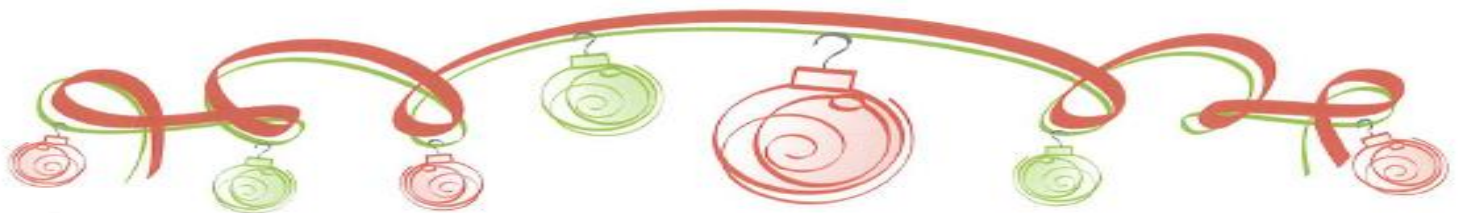
